COLLAPSED PUBLIC TOILETS AT BAMBA MARKET

**Hon. Shaban:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand on behalf of hon. Mwambire the Member for Bamba Ward who is away on official duty, I would like to read a Statement to the County Executive Committee Member in charge of the Department of Trade, Tourism & Cooperative Development, through the Chairperson; Economic Planning, Trade & Cooperative Development Committee:-

Whether the County Executive Committee Member in charge of Trade, Tourism & Cooperative Development is aware that at Bamba market public toilets collapsed last year? If yes, what measures has the County Executive Committee Member taken?

Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Mumba): Thank you very much. The Chairperson for Economic Planning, Trade & Cooperative Development Committee please make sure you handle this issue and bring feedback to this House in a span of 14 days.

Next, we have a Response from the Chairperson of the Health Committee on a Statement sought by the Member from Watamu Ward, Hon. George Baya, please proceed.

RESPONSE TO STATEMENT ON JIMBA DISPENSARY IN WATAMU

**Hon. Mwayaa:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir, on behalf of the Chairperson of the Health Committee I want to read the Response as follows:-

“The above subject matter refers:

Documents in our custody indicate as follows;

1. The project was awarded to Desert Dew Enterprises who was the lowest bidder of a tender sum of Ksh9, 371,257.
2. The project was paid in two certificates No. 1 was Kshs7, 422,956 and certificate No. 2 was Kshs1,814,488.70.

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3. The dispensary is a three roomed structure with one roomed servant quarter used as a store and not a two storied building as stated in the Statement.
4. The dispensary is operational. (Attached please find documents to support our statements). This is all we can state in relation to the dispensary. County Executive Member hon. Dr. Anisa.”

Thank you Mr. Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Mumba): Yes hon. George Baya.

**Hon. Baya:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. First of all, the amount is higher than the structure which already exists. According to the reports here, I also see an invoice totaling to Kshs9, 237, 000 in that invoice there is electrical work amounting to Kshs1.7 million. Electricity was already there provided under REA (Rural Electrification Authority) so I am surprised to see it in this invoice.

Second, I remember very well when we were passing the Supplementary Budget most of the ward projects were collapsed because there was a list of pending bills. In that list of pending bills referring to Jimba dispensary, it was budgeted Kshs9.4 million and in the list of pending bills, it is stated as Kshs3 million. Which is which now? I request the concerned party to explain to us, which document is wrong? Whether the list of pending bills we passed as the supplementary budget or this certificate which is paid?

In addition to this, I would like to ask where the BQ (Bill of Quantity) is for the additional two million shillings. So, I am not satisfied with this Response and I request for further scrutiny of this Report and if possible, we involve the auditors to go and do evaluations of this project to see if it is matching the figures stated here. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

**Hon. Mwayaa:** Mr. Speaker, Sir, I remember hon. Anisa was not then the CEC for Health so we need more time to go and investigate so that we can come back with a concrete answer.

**Hon. Ziro:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I have a concern on the figures here. If you look at this Response point number two, they are talking about the certificate of payment; number one has a figure of Kshs7, 422,956. This one corresponds to the payment certificate number one that is very correct. But when you come to number two, the figure stated in the certificate is Ksh 1,814,488.70 while the payment number figure is 1,814,998.66. I believe there is an alteration of the figures. According to me, I feel like this Response might be highlighting figures for another project. So, as the Chairperson goes to find out, may he also put this observation under consideration? Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Mumba): Yes hon. (Ms.) Amina.

**Hon. (Ms.) Amina:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I also rise to give my views on the Response we have received from the CEC Health. In my own observations, I think the CEC was not exhaustive in her answers. One; she has not provided the certificate of completion; does that mean the project is still on going?

Two; she has not accounted for the extra two million shillings budgeted for in the financial year 2017/2018. Then she has not provided the BQ. Instead, it is a summary that totals to Kshs9.3 million and the prayer asked for a breakdown of Ksh9.4 million. May this Committee consider the following observations that I have made. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Mumba): Hon. Members, having considered the weighty matter at hand and this being the second time the Response is being brought back to this House, I wish to direct that this matter is taken up again by the Committee so that they can fast-track it, follow it up and bring a conclusive Response to this House.

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We will not take it lightly that the House can be furnished with Responses that are not conclusive. The Committee on Health should take this matter seriously and bring a very conclusive Response to this House within a period of 14 days.
