**NOTICE OF MOTION**

**BUILDING OF MODEL YOUTH POLYTECHNICS**

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**Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu:** Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir. May, I table this Notice of Motion on behalf of hon. Teddy Mwambire of Sokoke ward. This Notice of Motion is directed to the County Executive Member for Education;

AWARE THAT, the Constitution of the Republic of Kenya, 2010 Schedule Four Part two, number nine gives mandate to pre-primary Education, Village Polytechnics, Home Craft centres and children facilities to be devolved.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, Article 55(a) of the Constitution assures the youths in accessing relevant education and training.

NOTING THAT, this County established model early Childhood Education centres in each ward.

AWARE THAT, most or all youth polytechnics in the County are not attractive to even the instructors.

This County Assembly urges the County Executive Member for Education to consider either refurbishing or building at least seven model Youth Polytechnics so as to boost the provision of technical training in the County. Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

#### HIGH MAST INSTALLATION PROJECT

**Hon. Kaunda:** Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir. I would like to move that this hon. Assembly adopts the Report on the Committee on Energy on high mast installation project implementation for the financial year 2013/2014 laid on the Table of this hon. House on Monday, 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2016. Thank you.

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Mwambire): Who is seconding?

**Hon. Kaunda:** I call upon hon. (Ms.) Kwekwe to second.

*(Hon. (Ms.) Kwekwe stood at her place to second)*

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Members, a Motion from the Energy Committee has been proposed and now is ready for debate.

*(Question proposed)*

Hon. (Ms.) Kwekwe, please.

**Hon. (Ms.) Kwekwe:** Asante Bw. Spika, kwa kunipa nafasi ili kujadili Ripoti hii. Kwa kweli hii Ripoti ni nzuri sana. Tulipotembelea Wadi zote zilizowekwa mataa haya ya *mulika mwizi*, kwa kweli mataa haya yaliwekwa kwa wakati mzuri na pahali pazuri ili kupunguza hatari nyingi ambazo zilikuwa zinawakumba. Mataa haya yalipunguza uhalifu na wizi. Mataa haya ni mazuri kwani watu wanaweza kufanya biashara zao wakati wa usiku. Ingawaje kuna changamoto ambazo zinakumba...

*(Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu stood on a Point of Order)*

**Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu:** Mheshimiwa Spika sielewi haya mataa ya *high mast* yakiitwa *mulika mwizi*, je anayeongea anaweza kutuelezea.

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**Hon. (Ms.) Kwekwe:** Pole sana, *mulika mwizi* ni mataa yale ambayo yanawaka kwa mwanga ambao ni mkubwa sana ambayo yanaweza...hayaitwi *mulika mwizi* ndio naomba msamaha naitoa hiyo. Ni mataa ambayo yanang'ara kwa ukubwa sana na yanatoa mwangaza mwingi ambapo watu wanaweza kuyatumia kwa biashara zao, hasa kwa biashara za usiku kama za kuuza vyakula haya mataa yanawasaidia sana.

Wakati ule mwingine kulikuwa hakuna hayo mataa wanabiashara walikuwa wanafunga biashara zao mapema, lakini sasa yanawasaidia sana kwa wakati huu ambapo mataa hayo yako. Pia mataa hayo yamepunguza wizi katika sehemu ambazo watu wanaishi. Zamani kulikuwa kukifanyika wizi na uhalifu mwingi pia uvutaji bangi ulikuwa unaendelea. Lakini yalipowekwa mataa hayo watu sasa wanapata nafuu. Tunaona kwamba mataa haya ni mazuri na tunaomba yawekwe kwa kila eneo la biashara ambalo liko katika wadi hizi ili yaweze kuwasaidia watu kuendesha biashara zao na waweze kuendesha kazi zao za usiku. Asante Bw. Spika na naunga mkono Ripoti hii.

**Hon. Mlanda:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand in support of the adoption of the Report on the high mast installation. These high masts are very important to our communities on the side of business dealing with this locality. I hope the adoption of this Report will also cater for the different trading centres not only those areas that were already installed for the last financial year. I also urge the Chairperson to visit those areas which did not get such projects so that they can also have the high masts installed.

The risk is there when we do not have these high masts installed in some trading centres. It is my hope that the Chairperson will take this initiative to visit those trading centres and avoid the risk of community members being raped at night and also those who sit in some areas have peace and security. I stand in support of the adoption of the Report.

**Hon. Matano:** Asante Mheshimiwa Spika. Nimesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii ambayo iko mbele yetu. Langu kuu ambalo nimesimama nalo ni kwamba kuletwa kwa mataa haya kumeinua kiwango cha usalama ndani ya Kaunti yetu ya Kilifi.

Nikiongea kutoka Kaloleni kuna taa moja ambalo tumewekewa na hilo taa limeleta mabadiliko makubwa katika mji wetu mdogo wa Kaloleni maana biashara zinaendelea hadi saa sita usiku. Hapo nyuma ulikuwa ukifika Kaloleni, ikifika saa mbili usiku ni kama kwamba ni jehanamu.

Langu ni ombi tu kwamba hapo nyuma tulipitisha hoja kuwa kila eneo la biashara ambalo tuko nalo katika Kaunti yetu mataa haya yaweze kupelekwa huko. Ni ombi langu Kamati hii vile wamezunguka wakaona uzuri wa haya mataa watie mkazo ili zile sehemu nyingine zipate mataa haya ili Kilifi yetu izidi kusonga mbele. Asante.

**The Leader of Minority (Hon. Pascal):** Thank you Mr. Speaker for giving me this opportunity to contribute towards this Report on the Floor of the House. Kenyans have been yearning for a 24-hour economy and that cannot be achieved if we do not have lights in our trading centres.

According to this Report, a big proposal has been made that all the trading centres should be installed with these high mast lights so that they can assist our communities. We understand that we have had so many trading centres coming up in villages and for us to have a vibrant economy, we should ensure that these trading centres are well lit so that Members of the public can have ample time to do business throughout the day and at night.

We understand for many years we have been affected by insecurity in the rural areas and in the towns that are not properly lit. With the installation of these high mast lights, we have seen

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a lot of improvement in the security sector. We have seen people walking freely without any interference especially at night. This has brought growth to our economy.

Let me stand to support this Report and again to urge the Finance Department to ensure that they set aside enough funds for us to achieve this. Thank you. I stand to support.

**The Leader of Majority (Hon. Mwingo):** Asante sana Mheshimiwa Spika kwa kunipatia hii nafasi. Nami nasimama kuunga mkono Ripoti ambayo iko mbele yetu. Kama tunavyojua ni kwamba giza la Mungu halikai mahali pamoja kwa hivyo maisha ya wakaaji wa Kilifi ni lazima yawe katika nuru ili tuweze kuendelea.

Mheshimiwa Spika, kama vile wenzangu walivyotangulia kuongea ni kwamba biashara za watu wetu wa Kilifi ni lazima ziendee ili kuboresha uchumi wetu. Kuwekwa kwa mataa haya ni dhahirisho wazi kwamba maisha ya wafanyi biashara wa Kilifi yatainuka maana wakati mwingi sana biashara zetu zinafungwa mapema na ni kwa sababu ya ukosefu wa mataa. Lakini ninaamini wakati mataa haya yatakapowekwa katika kila maeneo ya biashara basi biashara zetu zitadumu.

Usalama pia utaimarika kwa maana ukiangalia kwa mfano miji yetu ya Mtwapa, Majengo na Kikambala utakuta wakati mwingi sana watu wanalia inapofika usiku wanaibiwa vibeti vyao kwa sababu ya uhalifu lakini mataa haya yatakapoimarishwa kila mahali, nina hakika mambo haya yatafungua na wakaazi wa Kilifi watakuwa na uhuru wa kufanya biashara zao masaa ishirini na nne. Kwa hivyo mheshimiwa Spika, namesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii. Asante.

**Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir. I rise to support the adoption of this Report. Getting into the Secunder's message that we need to put high mast lights in all wards and this Report could be late. This is for financial year 2013/2014 we expect to have around 10 high mast lights in every ward. From 2013 financial year budget to date, it is the right time now we have all the wards light up.

Mr. Speaker, you understand the kind of darkness in most places; the trading centres and most business areas. Most of the businessmen have gone into losses. I would just give you an example of the young mothers who sell fish. Most of them use lanterns; they call it "taa la mkopo" in Swahili and most of the time they give more returns to the customer because of the darkness and they have gone into loss. When these high mast lights are put up, we are going to boost the business of the young women.

Look at a town like Mtwapa; there are so many businesses around Mtwapa, Watamu and Malindi but some have gone into loss because of doing business in the dark. When these lights are put up everybody will benefit out of them. Mr. Speaker, I stand to support. Thank you.

**Hon. Matsaki:** Asante sana Bw. Spika. Mimi pia nimesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii ili ipitishwe. Ukweli ni kwamba katika hizi biashara ambazo watu wetu wanafanya, zamani ilikuwa watu wanafanya kazi ikifika saa moja unusu au saa mbili wanafunga biashara hizo. Lakini inapokuwa mataa yanafanya kazi vizuri kila mahali katika yale maeneo ya biashara, ule wakati wa kazi pia unaongezeka mpaka saa tano saa sita.

Hii inamaanisha kwamba uchumi wa kaunti utapanda kwa asilimia hamsini kwa sababu watu wakitoka wengine nao wanaingia kufanyakazi. Kwa hivyo nimesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii kwa sababu itatupatia wakati mzuri wa kibiashara.

Pili, ni swala la uhalifu; mara nyingi unakuta kwamba watu wakiwa wanafanya kazi pahali ambapo kuna giza au mtu yuko katika barabara, pia hali hizo huwa zinasababisha wale vijana ambao ni wakora kuwavamia akina mama wetu na kuwapokonya pesa zao ambazo

wamezifanyia kazi. Lakini wakati ule wanafanya kazi katika sehemu ile ya soko, nina imani kabisa usalama unakuwa ni mzuri zaidi. Nimesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii. Asante sana.

**Hon. Mwayaa:** Asante sana Mheshimiwa Spika, kwa kunipatia nafasi hii nichangie kuunga mkono Ripoti hii. Ripoti hii ni nzuri na tunajua kwamba tunapomulika Jimbo letu la Kilifi hasa hii miji yetu midogo, biashara zitazidi kunawiri. Ushuru wetu pia huenda uongezeke kwa sababu tutakuwa tumewakisha miji yetu midogo na biashara zile ambazo tunalenga kutupatia ushuru zitakuwa zinaendelea.

Moyo wangu utapiga makofi zaidi wakati nitakapona kwamba wale watakaofanya ukaguzi wamefika kila kitongoji. Swala tata ambalo linaweza likatukumba sisi kama wakaazi wa Jimbo hili la Kilifi ni wakati ukaguzi utakapofanywa ufanywe upande mmoja ambapo ule upande mwingine kutakuwa bado kuna giza na huenda ikawa faida zikapatikana upande mmoja.

Kwa hivyo tukiendelea kuunga mkono swala hili, ukaguzi uweze kufanywa vilivyo; watu wanajua jimbo hili liko na Wadi 35 na ziweze kutembelewe vilivyo ili kwamba kila mahali tuhakikishe mradi huu wa kumulika miji yetu midogo ufike kila mahali.

Mheshimiwa Spika, kama bajeti ya juzi tuliona miradi ambayo ilikuwa haeleweki. Watu washaenda mbele na kuweka miradi na kujifanya kama ilikuwa ni “*revoted*.” Neno hili mimi lilinikwaza na ndio maana nasema kwamba kusiwe na ujanja kama ule. Miji midogo iweze kuwekwa haya mataa pengine matatu au manne, itakuwa ni kama hii miradi tuliyo nayo ikabandikwa jina ikaitwa “*revoted*”. Wakaguzi wafanye kazi yao kama watu wa Kilifi na wala sio kama watu wa nje ya Kilifi hii. Asante na naunga mkono.

**Hon. Kenga:** Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. First I wanted to rise on a Point of Order but given that the Member is already sited and has had his time to give out his contributions; it was about the issue of projects whether re-voted, new or ongoing projects. These are issues that need to be confirmed otherwise you cannot just stand and give an impression that maybe some Members are re-voting projects that are not supposed to be there. I think next time he should be given an opportunity to substantiate the remarks.

All the same Mr. Speaker, I am standing to demonstrate my support for the adoption of the Report of the Committee on Energy on high mast installation project implemented for the 2013/2014 financial year. Looking at the findings that were brought forth by the Committee as they went round the County, there are very many challenges that these Members of the Committee found as regard the issues of high mast; that some of the high mast lights were not fully operational and they have given the examples of Marikani, Kwa Njoro, Mazeras and you see, Mariakani is one of the busiest towns within the County of Kilifi.

Then another issue that was adequately looked into as one of the findings is about the security of the metre boxes and they were seen to be very exposed to the general public and anything could happen. Instead of them trying to help fight the issues of insecurity, it is coming out very clearly that the metre boxes are prone to theft because they are not secured. These are some of the challenges that are witnessed in this project.

Going forward, Mr. Speaker, it is very good as Members are making contributions that we need to grow our economy into a 24-hour economy and we need to do this in a secure environment through the recommendations that have been put forth by the Committee. I want to thank the hon. Chairperson who is proving to be very able in spearheading this docket and delivering what we want to see in the Department for us to have these installations put in each and every ward; that priority is given to the areas that have the high capacity of conducting businesses, market centres and townships within our areas where we can enhance business and ensure that we have a lot that is coming to the county as revenue.

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I know darkness cannot chase away darkness; it is only through light that we are in a position to chase darkness. This darkness once chased out from members of the community through the high mast lighting or the *mulika mwizi* as our hon. Lady was putting it, is really going to help the great people of Kilifi. Thank you very much and I beg to support.

**Hon. Hassan:** Asante mheshimiwa Spika kwa kunipatia nafasi hii. Mimi pia nasimama kuunga mkono Hoja hii. Kwanza napenda kupeana pongezi kwa mwenyekiti pamoja na Kamati yake kwa kuleta Hoja hii ya Kawi. Bado nitarudi pale kwa mheshimiwa Mwayaa; naomba kuisitiza yale maneno aliyoyazungumza kwamba haki itendeke. Isiwe tu kwamba haya mataa tunaona tu kwenye maandiko lakini matokeo yake katika utekelezaji ikawa ni tofauti kwa sababu tunaelewa inaongeza kasi ya uchumi na usalama; uchumi kama vile wa maeneo ya Mtwapa kama *Lollipop* ambapo ukipita panapendeza na tungependa maeneo mengi yawe mfano kama ule kwa sababu sote tunajua kabisa tunategemea Mtwapa katika uzalishaji mkubwa wa uchumi katika Kaunti ya Kilifi.

Tulikua na miradi ya siku mia moja (100) ambayo tulianza nafikiri 2013/2014 lakini matokeo yake kuna baadhi ya sehemu nyengine miradi ile ya siku 100 haikufika. Vile vile tulikua na *ECD (Early Childhood Development)* ikiitwa *modern ECD*. Ni jambo la kusikitisha kwamba mpaka sasa kuna maeneo ya wadi zengine hiyo miradi haijatekelezeka. Kwa hivyo langu ni kuisitiza mheshimiwa Spika, mbali na kuongea ...

*(Hon. Kenga stood on a Point of Order)*

**Hon. Kenga:** Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. I am rising on a Point of Order. The Member on the Floor is alleging that the kind of business that is taking place at Lollipop is the kind of business that the people of Kilifi would want to see taking place. I do not know whether this gives us the picture of the Kilifi we want to see.

*(Hon. Mlanda stood on a Point of Order)*

**Hon. Mlanda:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. In addition to that, can the Member explain about this Lollipop? Can he explain to this House because we do not know if it is an institution, trading place or what type of business is he talking about.

*(Hon. Mramba stood on a Point of Order)*

**Hon. Mramba:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am standing in defense of hon. Hassan. This information is already in the public domain that Lollipop is a bar and restaurant and several businesses are operating there including the commercial sex workers business.

**The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire):** Hon. Mramba you are out of Order! We do not have a point of defense in our Standing Orders.

*(Laughter)*

Proceed hon. Hassan.

**Hon. Hassan:** Asante sana mheshimiwa Spika. Labda ningeomba kuchukua nafasi hii kujaribu kuwaelimisha wanachama wenzangu kwa sababu tuko pamoja na wao, Hata hivyo,

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nashangaa kwamba leo wananikana lakini sioni maajabu maanake hata Petero alimkana Yesu dakika ya mwisho. Nimesimama kuunga mkono Hoja hii. Asante sana.

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. (Ms.) Dzidza:** Asante Mheshimiwa Spika. Pia mimi nimesimama kuunga mkono Ripoti hii na kusema kwamba nikiwa mwanakamati wa Kawi, tulienda kwingi na tukaona hayo mataa kweli yanasaidia haswa upande wa biashara na mnenaji alinena hapa kuhusu maswala ya Lollipop; hilo eneo liko na shughuli nyingi sana kwa hivyo pengine tumuelewe kwamba amemaanisha ki-biashara.

Mimi nasimama kuunga mkono haswa upande wa biashara. Mahali kama Gede kulikuwa na wizi sana haswa wenye biashara ya samaki walikuwa wanaibiwa vibeti vyao usiku lakini sasa mambo yako shwari. Naunga mkono Ripoti hii ipite na tuipitishie sote.

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Mwambire): Allow me to call the Mover to respond.

*(Question, that the Mover be now called upon to reply, put and agreed to)*

**Hon. Kaunda:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I would like to congratulate all the Members who have contributed in support of this Report and also calling for its adoption. When we received the Report in 2013/2014, as a Committee, we decided to go round and see the performance of the high mast lights or flood lights that were erected. When we went round we found a lot of challenges. We also heard from the people who were living around those places and took their views. We thought it better that the Department should, number one; see how they can overcome the challenges and, number two; gave recommendations so that the Department can actually implement.

What the Members have contributed so far in regards to the economy, when we went round we found that in those areas where high masts were erected; there were so many businesses especially the small business people selling *samaki*, *makuti* and other businesses. They told us that if we can have more of these high masts erected in every place, then Kilifi County will not be suffering anymore on the issue of employment because many will go into businesses even late into the night. I would also like to add on what other Members have said that we want to become a 24-hour working nation; we also want Kilifi County to become a 24-hour working county so that we can improve on our revenue collection.

Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to bring to the attention of this House one recommendation that the Committee made that the high mast projects to be implemented in all trading centres in the county. This is what we came up with after hearing from the people that in almost every trading centre, these high mast flood lights should be erected so that people and their businesses can be secured. More so, they can conduct businesses even up to the middle of the night so that they at least can put food on the table in every family. With those few submissions, thank you so much and I call all the Members to support.

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Members, a Motion to adopt the Report of the Committee on Energy on high mast installation project implementation has been tabled and well discussed. I now put the question.

### THE KILIFI COUNTY EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION BILL (ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 7), 2016

**The Chairperson** (Hon. Kenga): I want to take this opportunity to welcome all of you hon. Members to this sitting of the Committee of the Whole House to consider the Kilifi County Early Childhood Education Bill, 2016. Once we are through with this we are going to consider the Kilifi County Child Care Facilities Bill, 2016. Therefore I want to call upon each and every Member to fully engage him or herself in the business of the Committee of the Whole House and be ready and willing to contribute as we progress with the business of the Committee. Thank you.

*(Hon. Nzaka stood at his place)*

**The Chairperson** (Hon. Kenga): Yes hon. Chairperson.

*(Hon. Nzaka pointed at a paper he was holding)*

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**The Chairperson** (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Nzaka, I am being informed that there were no amendments that were forwarded on Clause 3. So you will only have an opportunity to rise and read the amendments of the Clauses that had already been forwarded to the Office of the Clerk. Thank you.

*(Clause 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 agreed to)*

*Clause 8(2)*

**Hon. Nzaka:** Thank you Mr. Chairperson. On behalf of the Committee on Early Childhood, Education and Children Welfare, I beg to move the following amendments:

THAT, Clause 8 (2) be rephrased to read “Regulations made under section (16) may-”.

*(Hon. Nzaka consulted with the Clerk-at-the-Table)*

**The Chairperson** (Hon. Kenga): Sorry about that hon. Members. The Chairperson was making consultations with the office of the Clerk. There seems to have been Clauses that he has not been able to move the amendments. Therefore we are going to give him an opportunity for him to move the amendments guided by the Clerk. I will also like to say that as we propose the question, it is also giving an opportunity to each Member who may have issues or contributions to be able to make them so that we fully participate in the process. Thank you.

**Hon. Nzaka:** Thank you Mr. Chairperson, I beg to move some amendments:

THAT, Clause 3 (1)(b) be amended by deleting the word “seven” immediately before the word “day” and replace thereof with the word “five.”
