**COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR**

**COMMITTEE ON POWERS AND PRIVILEGES TO INVESTIGATE THE MATTER OF MEMBERS’  
ABSENTEEISM IN THE PLENARY AND COMMITTEE SITTINGS**

**The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kombo):** I have Communication on plenary and committee sittings.

Hon. Members, The County Assembly is established under Article 185 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and entrusted with onerous responsibilities which have been summed up in Section 8 of the County Governments Act, 2012 that are expected to be discharged with the seriousness they deserve.

Further, Chapter Six of the Constitution prescribes the form of behaviour of State officers; the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 as read together with the County Assemblies Powers and Privileges Act, 2017 and the Assembly Standing Orders require us to uphold certain attributes that set us apart from those we represent and conduct ourselves following certain codes.

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Hon. Members, the conduct of business in this Assembly is largely governed by the Constitution and Statutes. However, to a large extent, we apply the provisions of our standing Orders and the Speaker's Rules as the guiding principles to the seamless conduct of business like any other legislature.

Hon. Members, it has come to my attention that Plenary on several occasions has failed to raise quorum to conduct important business as scheduled by the House Business Committee on the Order Papers due to absenteeism of the Members.

In addition, Members fail to attend Committee Meetings to assist the Committee to properly dispense off business before them. You were sent here by your constituents who entrusted you with the power to represent their interests. How will that be achieved if you do not attend Plenary and Committee sittings?

Hon. Members, May I draw your attention to the provisions of Standing Order 225 (1) that provides, and I quote:

“If, during any Session, a Member is absent from eight sittings of the Assembly without permission, in writing from the Speaker, the Speaker shall report the matter to the Assembly and the matter shall stand referred to the Committee of Privileges for hearing and determination.”

Further, Standing Order 175(1) provides, and I quote:

“If a member fails to attend four consecutive sittings of a Committee without the written permission of the Chairperson of the Committee, or the permission of the Speaker, if the member is the Chairperson, the Chairperson or the Speaker, as the case may be shall notify the Committee of the failure.”

It should be noted that there are specific consequences specified under the provision of this Standing Order.

Hon. Members, the lack of specific cases of absenteeism notwithstanding, the lack of continued lack of quorum during plenary sittings points to possible cases.

I, therefore, call upon the Select Committee on Powers and Privileges to investigate the matter of absenteeism in the Plenary and Committee sittings and report to the House. Further, I call upon the Chairpersons in the respective Committees to enforce the provisions of Standing Order 175 going forward. The Chairperson of the Liaison Committee is hereby directed to guide the Chairpersons of the Committees on the proper enforcement of the foregoing provisions.

Hon. Members, further to this guidance I have issued, I wish to notify the House that beginning the Third Assembly, Third Session which will be on Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> February 2024 the registration of Chamber attendance will be done solely through biometric registration devices located in the Chamber.

Subsequently, all forms of manual registrations that have been so far been undertaken through the Office of the Sergeant-at-Arms shall stand suspended at the rise of the House on Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> December 2023.

The Clerk of the County Assembly will be expected to make necessary arrangements during the long recess to ensure that biometric registration devices are installed at appropriate locations and are operational. I hastily add that registration is the sole responsibility of a Member. The House stands guided! Thank you, hon. Members. Hon. Teddy Mwambire Ngumbao, Speaker of the County Assembly of Kilifi. ### PERSONAL STATEMENT

#### CLARIFICATION ON FALSE ACCUSATIONS MADE AGAINST HON. RASHID

**Hon. Rashid:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, for this opportunity. I rise to make a Personal Statement Pursuant to Standing Order 81. This is to notify you of my intention to rise Pursuant to Standing Order 81 to give a personal Statement regarding false accusations levelled against me on the issuance of bursaries to the Malindi Town Ward Scholarship Committee and the Scholarship Board by the Officer working at the County Executive.

The false accusations levelled against me have led to defamation, character assassination, profiling, threats and endless abuse of me and my family on social media sites. The Personal Statement I shall issue shall set the records straight on the accusations leveled against me since I do not undertake any role in the operations of the Scholarship Fund at the Ward level and at the Board level.

My role as a Ward Representative that is; Malindi Town Ward Representative as cited by the Constitution and the Standing Orders, is that I am a representative of my people, I do oversight and legislation. The false accusations which are going around the social media are so unfortunate that...

*(Hon. Meso stood on a Point of Order)*

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Kombo): Yes, hon. (Ms.) Meso. You can take your seat hon. Rashid Odhiambo.

**Hon. (Ms.) Meso:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir. I think the Member on the Floor, the area MCA (Member of County Assembly) in my Ward hon. Rashid Odhiambo told us that it is a Statement but now the way I am seeing is like he wants to debate about it. So, can you direct us Mr. Speaker?

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Kombo): Okay, I have heard you hon. (Ms.) Meso, that is a Personal Statement and it does not require any answering. Just listen to what the hon. Member on the Floor is stating and that is it. Continue, Hon. Odhiambo.

**Hon. Rashid:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is a Personal Statement, and I am explaining myself. It has to be very clear that the Members who came out and mentioned my name on Social media, that one Political Advisor to the Office of the Governor who is acting Chief of

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Staff Mr. Mramba, it has to be very clear that he is not a Member of the Scholarship Board Committee or the Scholarship Board and he has no right to speak on behalf of the Board.

It is very clear that, this is political assassination. It is very clear that this is witch-hunting, and it is also very clear that this is a political war. The allegations which were made by this Member, how do I get in as an area MCA? As I had put it very clearly from the beginning, of my responsibilities of legislation, oversight, and representation, I have the rights to recommend or to contribute in any matter affecting the Member of Town Ward when I have information. I came in to this issue, whereby the Committee was alleged to have given the bursaries to a school which does not exist by the name Beluga Girls High School. I personally visited the school, I saw the document and it has to be very clear that the school by the time I visited, I found the following: the school has a registration certificate with the registration number 03P2000/01EG. The school has registration from the business that is BNMXL6EQ registration from the registrar of companies.

It also has to be very clear that the school was inspected by the County Government of Kilifi Public Health and approved on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2019 and the inspection report was signed by then name Alex Maitha, public health officer from Malindi Sub-County office and he recommended for the licensing of the school. The reference is SCPHO/MLD/A7/UOLI/0020. There is a record of payment in the County Government of Kilifi, Malindi Sub-County for the Single Business Permit which was issued in 2019.

With the number 2019/576839 and with the receipt which was issued which was number 19187 amounting to Kshs23,200 and it has to be very clear that the customer's name on this receipt was Beluga Girls High School in Barani. It was received by Arnold Angawa on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2019. The school is also registered with the Kenya Revenue Authority holding registration PO518011801/8711. It also has to be very clear that the school has received several cheques from different areas. I witnessed cheque number 7195 of Kshs10,000 from NG-CDF (National Government Constituency Development Fund) Lamu West and this was on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2022.

The said school also received a cheque from NG-CDF Jomvu, cheque number 111275 in the amount of Kshs195,000 on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022. The school also received several cheques even from NG-CDF Malindi and many others. There is also evidence that the Ministry of Education Malindi Sub-County wrote a letter to the Kenya National Examination Council that is KNEC requesting KNEC to provide an examination center code number for Beluga Girls High School and this was on minute 098/2019 and it was signed by the named officer Julius Fikirini.

By the fact that those who issue statements on behalf of the Ward Scholarship Board are not members of the Scholarship Board that is as I mentioned earlier; Mr. Nixon Mramba, Political Adviser Office of the Governor and Mr. Phillip Charo, Chief Officer Roads. This clearly shows that there is a political motive and witch-hunting because they have no mandate to speak or to give a statement on behalf of the Board. This House and the public need to understand that the Members of this House need to be respected and insulting a Member of this House is insulting the Whole House.

Our dignity has to be dignified and our respect has to be maintained as members of this House. It is very wrong for any junior officer or subordinate staff to move around with the name of the Member of this House. I want to finish by saying that this is a House of Law, this is a respected House, and anything ought to follow the right procedure and the Standing Orders. When I went into detail, I came to realize even those who were speaking plus the Chairman of

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the Board who is the Chief Officer of Education Mr. Nguma openly violated and contradicted the Kilifi County Scholarship Act. It will be very wrong because if people go out and start making their own decisions without following the Standing Orders without following our Act, we have a right to defend our Act, we have a right to defend our images and we have the right to defend our Constitution. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir.

#### THE KILIFI COUNTY SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE BILL (ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3), 2023

**The Temporary Chairperson** (Hon. (Ms.) Sophia): Welcome back, hon. Members. We are here this afternoon to consider the Kilifi County Sexual and Gender-Based Violence Bill, 2023. The rules are relaxed. I will now welcome the Clerk to read Clause by Clause as we proceed. Thank you.

*(Clause 3 agreed to)*

*New Clause 4(11)*

**Hon. (Ms.) Sidi:** Thank you, Madam Chairperson. I beg to move:

THAT, Clause 4 be amended by;

1. Inserting a New Clause 4(11) to read as follows;

4(11) the following multi-Sectoral agencies will be responsible for the following:

A) The National Government will be responsible for;

1. Facilitates inter-agency and inter Sectoral planning for GBV response in prevention, protection, prosecution, monitors compliance with legislation and international conventions.
2. Facilitates the development of inter-agency systems for incident reporting, documentation, referrals, information sharing, monitoring and evaluation and coordination.
3. Overall leadership and coordination in policy implementation and resource mobilization, data aggregation and analysis.

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4. Government agencies will be relevant in budgeting, facilitating the application and enforcement of GBV law and policies.
  5. Delivering GBV health related services at National and County level such as health financing, trauma counseling, treatment of victims/survivors, community health awareness. Effective participation in multi-sectoral referral infrastructure.
  6. Providing continuous capacity building to staff on GBV health related services.
  7. The Directorate of Peace Building and Conflict Management Directorate (PBCM) within the Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government is responsible for the coordination of all peace related interventions in Kenya. Also responsible in providing a framework for mobilizing, coordinating and consolidation county peace committees, who are the sub-county level and tasked to address GBV issues.
  8. Conducive learning conditions and ensuring safety of learners while in school.
  9. Administration of justice for GBV victims/ survivors.
  10. Ensuring a standardized and coordinated government approach on matters relating to GBV.
  11. Streamlining the development and implementation of legislation particularly developing and reviewing legislation to strengthen and accommodate modern methods of evidence delivery.
  12. Prosecutes criminal offenses and ensures effective administration of criminal justice system. Prosecutes election offenses.
  13. Provides security through enforcement of law and order; provides security personnel during election activities; investigates GBV offenses and collaborates with the Department of Public Prosecution (DPP) on law enforcement.
  14. Develop bail and sentencing policies to assist in determining cases of GBV in a manner consistent with the law and Constitution and ensure speedy determination of cases.
- B) The private sector will be responsible for;
1. Adhere to the legislation and public policies as well as improved practices on their part in support of prevention and redressing GBV.
  2. Mainstreaming gender-based violence, including sexual harassment in the workplace policies and also ensuring enforcement of employee related policies at the workplaces.
  3. Financing of GBV programmes including engagement in Public-Private Partnerships, CSR towards components of GBV prevention, protection (e.g. infrastructure).
  4. Participation in data collection on GBV trends in the country.
  5. Implementation of the GBV Policy through adoption of codes of conduct aimed at tackling GBV in the workplace.
- C) The Civil Society Organization will be responsible for;
1. Policy advocacy and campaign against Gender-Based Violence (GBV), Sexual reproductive rights either collectively or individually.

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2. Contribute towards development by implementing community programmes and facilitate adoption of gender responsive law and policy practices at community level.

6. A paralegal or case manager.
7. A representative from the community policing team.
8. A representative from court users committee members.
9. A representative from a community-based organization representing the interest of children, women, persons with disability, older members of the society and interested development partners.

8(2) (b) Functions of the Committee Ward Gender-Based Violence Management Committee:

1. Coordinate the response to and prevention of victimization such as sexual and Gender-Based violence.
2. Implement the policies of the management committee.
3. Act as the first point of reference for victims of abuse.
4. Act as a link between victims and the justice system.
5. Advise the management committee on the sustainability of victims to be declared vulnerable victims in need of special care and protection.
6. Perform any other function as may be assigned by the county management committee.

8(2) (c) The Member of the two committees in Clause 8 may be reimbursed for reasonable for out-of-pocket expenses necessarily incurred by them in the performance of their duties subject to any policy adopted by the County Executive Member of Gender, Culture, Sports, and Social Service with the consultation of County Executive Member of Finance.

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## REPORT

### THE KILIFI COUNTY SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE BILL (ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3), 2023

**The Deputy Speaker** (Hon. Kombo): Chairperson, humbly report to the House on the findings.

**Hon. (Ms.) Sophie:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir. I beg to report that the Committee of the Whole House has considered the Kilifi County Sexual and Gender-Based Violence Bill, 2023 and approved the same with amendments. Thank you.

**Hon. (Ms.) Sidi:** Hon. Speaker, I beg to move that the House do agree with the Committee in the said Report. I want to call upon hon. Morris Hinzano to second.

**Hon. (Ms.) Sidi:** I wish to thank the office and the committee Members for the support that we received during deliberations on this Bill. Today we want to enact this law so that it can help the community at large and the people of Kilifi.
