The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Next Order!

Second Reading

THE KILIFI COUNTY INVESTMENT CORPORATION AND DEVELOPMENT BILL, 2019

Hon. Daniel: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I beg to move that the Kilifi County Investment Corporation and Development Bill be read a Second Time. I call hon. George Baya to second.

(Hon. Baya seconded)

(Question proposed)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Yes, proceed.

Hon. Daniel: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. The Kilifi County Investment and Corporation Bill, 2019 was published in Kenya Gazette Supplementary No. 3 of 20th February 2019. The Bill originated from the Executive Arm of the Government. The Bill is sponsored by hon. Adamson Mwathethe, the Leader of Majority in the County Assembly of Kilifi. The Kilifi County Investment Development Corporation Bill was read a First Time on Tuesday, 14th June 2019.

Pursuant to Standing Order No. 120, the Bill was committed to the Sectoral Committee on Economic Planning, Trade and Co-operative Development for consideration.

Article 196 (1) (b) of the Constitution provides that:-

“196. (1) A county assembly shall—

(b) facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of the assembly and its committees.”

Standing Order No. 120 (3)(A) states that:-

“(3A) The Sectoral Committee shall take into account the views and recommendations of the public under paragraph (3) in its Report to the House.”

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According to the objective in the Memorandum of Understanding, the purpose of this Bill is to provide for the establishment of legal and institutional framework for the investment...

(Hon. Kiraga stood on a Point of Order)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): What is it hon. Member for Gongoni?

Hon. Kiraga: Mr. Speaker, I am not getting what the Member is trying to read. I do not know whether he is also obeying the standing Orders. I have forgotten the relevant Standing Order. Mr. Speaker, please guide us on the same.

Hon. Daniel: Sorry, maybe I was very...

(Hon. Mwarandu stood on a Point of Order)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Kiraga, kindly take your seat. Let us hear what hon. Mwarandu has to say.

Hon. Mwarandu: Thank you Mr. Speaker for this opportunity. The hon. Member for Gongoni hon. Kiraga who is also the owner of Kinyole Island can not purport to talk about Standing Orders whereby he has breached the Standing Orders. This is a House of honour and dignity. If a senior hon. Member can stand before this House while his shirt is hanging, it lowers the dignity of this House. We cannot talk of breaching the Standing Orders because he too has done it. My prayer is that you take action against him.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you hon. Mwarandu. Hon. Kiraga being a senior Member of the House, you must be very conversant with the Standing Orders. Therefore, it has been brought to my attention that you are not in decorum. If that is the position, then excuse yourself, go and dress up properly then come back. Can you stand up so that Members are able to see you?

(Hon. Kiraga stood in his place)

(Laughter)

Thank you. Though he may have done it when the Member was raising the issue, I think he is okay and business can proceed. Otherwise, for the Member who is moving, it is time to debate. I think the concern by the Member for Gongoni was that it seems like you are reading. You are supposed to move and generate ideas on why you are advocating for the Second Reading so that it can move to the final stages of the Bill. That is the concern by the Member for Gongoni but again for areas where you feel you have to read especially when you need to quote some important sections of the Bill, it is allowed. Please proceed. What is your Point of Order hon. Mramba?

Hon. Mramba: I wish to put the record straight. Hon. Mwarandu was saying hon. Kiraga is the owner of Kinyole; that island is called Kinyaule not Kinyole...

(Laughter)

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The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): I think you are both out of order by saying he is the owner of a certain property and there is nothing you can produce to justify your case. Hon. Mramba and hon. Mwarandu, you are out of order. So you are protected Hon. Daniel. Kindly proceed.

Hon. Daniel: According to the objective of the Memorandum of Understanding, the purpose of this Bill is to provide establishment of legal institutional framework for investment in Kilifi County. This Bill is set in four parts; Part one of the Bill provides for the preliminary which includes the Short Title and the commencement date, interpretation of the terms used in the Bill as well as the object and purpose of the Bill. Part two provides for the establishment, composition, function on investments, development, corporation and board to manage the corporation.

Part three, the Bill provides for the financial provision such as the funds of the corporation, accounts, annual budget, financial reports, audit and annual reports. Part four of the Bill provides for the investments management principles and investments powers. Part five of the Bill provides for the miscellaneous matters which include regulations and conduct of business and affairs of the board. The enactment of the Bill will not occasion additional expenditure of public funds.

Mr. Speaker, Sir, after scrutiny and deliberating on the Kilifi County Investment and Development Corporation Bill, 2019 the Committee made the following specific recommendations to the Bill which are to be adopted by the hon. House and amendments be made as is in the Kilifi County Investment and Development Corporation Bill, 2019 Report. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Kibarani hon. Mwamtsi.

Hon. Mwamtsi: Mr. Speaker, the Kilifi County Investments and Corporation Bill is an idea which is long overdue. I remember during the 90's, most of the companies that were operating in Kilifi collapsed. Now we are forced to revive them; subsequent regimes have been coming and going and no company in Kilifi has been revived.

When this Bill is put in place, it will provide a platform for the people of Kilifi County to invest in this corporation. It will make individuals buy shares in a corporation so that they can revive the cashew nut factory that the people of Kilifi have been yearning for years. So this is a Bill that I am urging the Members to support because it will open up avenues for the people of Kilifi without entirely depending on the government. This is because at least the funds will be originating from the people themselves. So, I stand to support. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Hon. Mwambire: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Sir for giving me this opportunity to support the passage of this Bill. First and foremost, I want to say that today, most youth of this county and Kenya in general lack jobs. As we understand, people are getting skills and knowledge but there are no jobs where they can go and seek for employment. The Kilifi County Investment and Development Cooperation Bill will open many windows to see that the county makes substantial investments in order to curb the shortage of employment. So, I stand to support this Bill and I believe that when enacted, it will enhance investments in the county both in the private and public sector. Thank you so much Mr. Speaker for giving me this opportunity. I stand to support it.

Hon. (Ms.) Messo: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand to support the Bill because it will create jobs for the youth in this county and at the same time also help; we say in Kiswahili "akina mama" because as we all know, it has become a problem to get money since they will be

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getting loans. This Bill will help them a great deal and will also cover people living with disabilities. This is a Bill that I can say will cater for everybody in Kilifi. I humbly beg this House to adopt it. Thank you so much Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Hon. Humphrey Kombe Mwarandu.

Hon. Mwarandu: Thank you Mr. Speaker for giving me this opportunity. I rise to support this Bill. However, I want to poke holes on the process on which the Committee made their Report. Members have been given this Report 15 minutes ago while the Standing Orders clearly state that a Report shall be given to the Members 48 hours before it being tabled. I do not know who to blame, is it the Clerk's Department or the Committee at large?

Number two; we are not doing this Bill for ourselves or the elites of this county. We are doing this law for the people of this county and I am saying this because the Public Participation Act; under the general public participation guidelines part four says that "The relevant institution shall give the public adequate notice to make their input on the issue."

For the purposes of that paragraph, the responsible authority or institution shall establish mechanism to enable the widest reach. Here we have two words; adequate time and the widest reach which may include television station, information communication technology centres, website, communication radio stations, public meetings and gatherings and traditional mediums. That is echoed even in our Standing Orders...

(Hon. (Ms.) Messo stood on a Point of information)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): There is an intervention from hon. (Ms.) Auma Messo.

Hon. (Ms.) Messo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I would like to inform the hon. Member that we did public participation.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Order hon. Member! Let us hear from the Member whether he would like to be informed.

Hon. Mwarandu: I know what she wants to say however, I want to be informed because information is power.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Inform him.

Hon. (Ms.) Messo: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I would just like to inform him that public participation was done. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Proceed.

Hon. Mwarandu: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I was saying that...

(Hon. Kiraga stood on a Point of Order)

Hon. Kiraga: Mr. Speaker, I am standing on a Point of Order under Standing Order No. 120(3), I would wish to read:-

“(3) The Sectoral Committee to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate public participation on the Bill through an appropriate mechanism, including—

- (a) inviting submission of memoranda;
- (b) holding public hearings;
- (c) consulting relevant stakeholders in a sector; and

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(d) consulting experts on technical subjects.”

Mr. Speaker, I think the Member on the Floor should go deep or go to the dictionary and get the meaning of ‘including.’ To my understanding, if the Committee went into any one of these, then public participation was done. From his submissions, he is trying to purport that public participation was not done by the Committee. However, I am quite sure that public participation was done because there was an invitation of submission of memoranda and that is purely public participation as enshrined in our Standing Orders.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): You seem to be sharing the same copy of the Standing Orders and it may disadvantage the Member who is on the Floor. Proceed.

Hon. Mwarandu: Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. I like hon. Kiraga so much and because of how he put it, anyway, I want to bring to the attention of this House that these Standing Orders cannot overturn an Act of Parliament. Two words here come out very clearly under these general public participation guidelines and that is the ‘relevant institution’ which is the County Assembly of Kilifi shall give the public adequate notice. I was coming to that; adequate notice to make the public give their inputs on the issue Mr. Speaker.

The second word is the ‘widest’ reach. The public participation which was done by this Assembly or by the Committee was via the dailies. That is why I was saying that we are not doing this Bill for the elite. How many people in this County can afford reading these newspapers? Mr. Speaker, the Chairperson Budget...

(Hon. Kiraga stood on a Point of Order)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): What is your Point of Order Hon. Kiraga?

Hon. Kiraga: Mr. Speaker, the Member on the Floor is misleading this House by saying that public participation was done through the dailies. The dailies were only used to inform the public that we need a Memorandum from the public and they were given enough time. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Mwarandu Proceed.

(Laughter)

Hon. Mwarandu: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I really need your input on how much time is enough time Mr. Speaker. Because the Notice that was given for the submission of the Memorandum was published on 25th June 2019 and the deadline was 5th July 2019 so I need your guidance.

However, I was saying that the Public Participation Act stipulated that the institution under the public participation guidelines Part Four, I was on widest reach which may include the dailies but I was saying how many people in this County are able to buy and read newspapers? Am not opposing this Bill in any way but I think we have to come up with the right procedure of coming up with Reports .Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much. The seconder, hon. Baya.

Hon. Baya: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand to support this Motion as the Seconder of this Bill .This is a very important Bill. I know in Kilifi County there has been a crisis in the investment regulation and only in this Bill will we be in control of investors and also give

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opportunities to local investors. I do not have much to say but to kindly request this House to accept and adopt this Bill. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Finally the hon. Member for Garashi, hon. Ziro

Hon. Ziro: Asante sana mheshimiwa Spika. Kwanza nasimama kupeana kongole kwa naibu Mwenyekiti wa Kamati hii ya *Economic Planning* kwa kuonyesha ufasaha wake wa lugha kujaribu kueleza ndani ya Bunge hili juu ya mjadala huu. Amejaribu kueleza jinsi mjadala huu ulivyo.

Pili, nachukua nafasi hii kuunga mkono Mswada huu. Ni Mswada ambao ulikuja tukaufanyia ukaguzi...

(Hon. Mwarandu stood on a Point of Order)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): There is an intervention from hon. Mwarandu. Hon. Ziro take your seat.

Hon. Mwarandu: Mheshimiwa Spika, mimi ni muenzi wa lugha ya Kiswahili na siwezi ona mtu wa aina yoyote dunia hii akidhalilisha lugha ya Kiswahili. Mheshimiwa tunayemuenzi wa Garashi Bw. Ziro amesema anataka kumpa kongole ‘mwanachini’ sijui alikuwa anaaminisha nini kwa sababu katika ufahamu wangu wa Kiswahili maanake tukisoma wakati huo tuliambiwa tutukuze Kiswahili; sasa sijui alikuwa anasema mwanachini ama anafahamu... ama ni lugha mufti? Asante mheshimiwa Spika.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Ziro kindly proceed.

Hon. Ziro: Asante mheshimiwa Spika. Kwanza nataka kumjuza Mheshimiwa ambaye ametoka kuongea awache kuleta akili zake ndogo katika Bunge hili. Kuna maneno mengi ya Kiswahili kwanza kuna mwanachini, naibu, kuna Kiswahili cha Pemba, Unguja, Tanzania na Mkoa wa Pwani na sehemu tofauti duniani. Sasa akijifanya anajua Kiswahili na alitoka hapa Pemba na akaja hapa juzi na hata twajua Kiswahili alianguka hiyo naona mheshimiwa anatupotezea wakati. Mimi langu nilikuwa ni kuunga mkono Hoja hii kwa jinsi vile ambavyo...

Hon. Mwarandu: I have a Point of Order!

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): What is your Point of Order hon. Mwarandu? Hon. Ziro take your seat.

Hon. Mwarandu: Mheshimiwa Spika, nasimama kwa Hoja ya nidhamu nambari 87. Mheshimiwa wa Garashi amesema kinaga ubaga mbele ya Bunge hili kuwa mimi nilianguka Kiswahili. Nataka aeleze Bunge hili sasa hivi kwa sababu hauwezi kuwa mbele ya vinakili sauti na ukasema mheshimiwa wa hadhi kubwa kama mimi nilianguka Kiswahili. Mimi mheshimiwa Spika nataka kupitia kanuni zetu za Bunge 87 atoe ushahidi mbele ya Bunge hili. Hilo ni kwanza.

Pili, sijapelekwa hospitali yoyote kwa umri huu ambao ninao kwa sababu ya akili punguani. Wala sijapelekwa Loliondo kwa babu mheshimiwa Spika. Sasa mheshimiwa akisimama mbele ya Bunge hili na aseme kwamba nina akili ndogo, hiyo ni kumaanisha kwamba nina akili punguani na mtu mwenye akili punguani ni sawa sawa na kusema ni mtu mwenye wazimu. Nataka ushauri wako mheshimiwa Spika kwa sababu hiyo ni kudhalilisha mheshimiwa mwenzako mbele ya Bunge hili, mbele ya vinasau sauti hivi. Mheshimiwa spika, nataka ushauri wako katika Bunge hili. Asante.

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The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. The hon. Member has risen on a Point of Order under Standing Order No.87 and I want to take him through the same Standing Order:-

“Responsibility for statement of fact

87. (1) A Member shall be responsible for the accuracy of any facts which the Member alleges to be true and may be required to substantiate any such facts instantly.

(2) If a Member has sufficient reason to convince the Speaker that the Member is unable to substantiate the allegations instantly, the Speaker shall require that such Member substantiates the allegations not later than the next sitting day, failure to which the Member shall be deemed to be disorderly within the meaning of Standing Order 108 (Grave Disorder) unless the Member withdraws the allegations and gives a suitable apology, if the Speaker so requires.”

Therefore on the two issues that the Member has raised one; on the ‘*akili ndogo*’ issue, kindly I request that you withdraw; that is un-parliamentary. He is a colleague, a hon. Member and I believe you are out of order on that so, kindly withdraw.

On the issue of having failed in Kiswahili as you put it, if you have any proof to be tabled before the Assembly, well and good and in the absence of that, then you withdraw, apologize and we proceed.

Hon. Ziro: Mheshimiwa Spika, kwa upande wa ‘*akili ndogo*’ nafikiri nataka nijieleze kwa sababu yeye amezungumza na pia akasema akili ndogo inamaanisha akili punguani na ni kuonyesha ni mtu ambaye ni mwenda wazimu. Lakini mimi nataka kumpunguzia mzigo kwa sababu yeye ameeleza mambo mengi na mimi nimetaja tu neno moja “*akili ndongo*” *and that means small idea* mheshimiwa Spika. Sikumaanisha kwamba nilikuwa namkejeli ama kuonyesha kwamba namdhalilisha mbele ya Bunge hili lakini nilikuwa najaribu kuonyesha kwamba yale maneno ambayo ameyazungumza ndio ambayo maana yake iko chini sana...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Now, to the understanding of the Members, it warrants that you withdraw; you are out of Order so kindly, withdraw and apologize.

Hon. Ziro: Kwa *Members* ama kwake yeye?

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): He raised the same to the Speaker and to the understanding of the Speaker, you are out of Order.

Hon. Ziro: I apologize for that.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you.

Hon. Ziro: Ile ya masomo akitupatia zile nakala zake basi nitajua kama alipita ama alianguka mheshimiwa Spika. Kwa hivyo, alete kile cheti chake cha kidato cha nne tuangalie Kiswahili alipata nini ndio tujue kama yale anayozungumza yeye ni kweli ama yale yangu ndio ya kweli. Kama yangu ni ya ukweli, ni sawa kama yake ni ya ukweli nitaomba radhi lakini mheshimiwa Spika, huwezi kuniambia niombe radhi saa hii na hajaleta makaratasi yake.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Order! Order hon. Member. You are the one who raised the issue...

Hon. Ziro: Alete makaratasi mheshimiwa Spika halafu tuyakague vizuri sana na yawe ni yale ya haki...

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The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Peter Ziro you are out of Order! You are the one who has raised the allegation and you are the one who is required by the Standing Orders to substantiate. Therefore, if you cannot be able to substantiate, kindly withdraw and apologize.

Hon. Ziro: I think Mr. Speaker you are being unfair to me...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Kindly withdraw and apologize.

Hon. Ziro: Okay, because you have said I withdraw, I withdraw Mr. Speaker.

(Hon. Kiraga stood on a Point of Order)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. What is your Point of Order Kiraga?

Hon. Kiraga: Mr. Speaker, before I put my Point of Order, there is very urgent information here that the hon. Bomet Governor Joyce Laboso, 58 years, dies of cancer while undergoing treatment at Nairobi Hospital. Mr. Speaker, we are running short of quorum so, probably you will give some guidance on that.

QUORUM

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Clerk, is there quorum?

The Clerk-at-the Table: Mr. Speaker, we do not have quorum.

(Some Members walked in before the Division Bell was rung)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Ziro, you are a Member of the Committee and Members want to do this Business. Kindly can you take your seat? In fact, you had not concluded your contributions, where are you going?

Hon. Ziro: I had concluded.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): No, you had not. Is there quorum?

The- Clerk at-the Table: We have quorum Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Hon. Ziro, kindly conclude.

Hon. Ziro: Mheshimiwa Spika, nilikuwa nazungumza kwa lugha ya Kiswahili, wajua yale ma *Point of Order* yamenikoroga kidogo nikaanza kuchanganyikiwa. Nilikuwa nataka kusema kwamba wakati tulipopata marekebisho ya Mswada huu, tulienda tukarekebisha zile sehemu ambazo zilikuwa zinataka kurebisha kwa sababu tuliona umuhimu wa Hoja hii ikija Bungeni hapa na kupitishwa itasaidia Kaunti yetu ya Kilifi kuleta ajira kwa vitengo tofauti tofauti katika Kaunti yetu. Tumefanya hivyo kwa imani kwamba itapita katika Bunge hili ili kusudi iweze kutumika kuweza kupatia nafasi za kazi kwa watu wetu wa Kilifi. Kufikia hapo mheshimiwa Spika, naomba kuunga mkono Hoja hii kikamilifu. Asante.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Malindi Town Ward.

Hon. Kadenge: Asante pia mheshimiwa Spika kwa kunipa nafasi hii ya kuchangia Mswada huu. Nikiwa pia Memba wa kamati ya *Economic Planning*, hii kamati kama mnavyojua inaongozwa na wazee wawili mmoja akiwa ni yule mheshimiwa ambaye ni Simba wa Garashi na amekuwa akituongoza vizuri na tumepitia kila kitengo na tunaona huu Mswada...

Hon. Mramba: Point of Order Mr. Speaker!

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Mramba what is your Point of Order?

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Hon. Mramba: Mr. Speaker, we are hearing a new name here. Since the day I came to this Assembly I have never heard an MCA called Simba wa Garashi. That is a nickname and it should remain outside the Chamber Mr. Speaker and not in this Chamber. We need him to explain who that Member is.

Hon. Kadenge: Nashukuru Bw. Spika. Nafikiri mheshimiwa Mgogo hayuko; mheshimiwa Mgogo yeye hakai karibu na mheshimiwa ambaye zamani alikuwa akijulikana kama Peter Ziro lakini saa hizi yuko na *affidavit* na hilo jina litakuwa *declared in public* ya kuwa anitwa Simba wa Garashi.

Hon. Mramba: Point of Order Mr. Speaker!

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): What is your Point of Order Hon. Mramba?

Hon. Mramba: Mr. Speaker, hon. David Kadenge is claiming that my name is Mgogo but my name is Nixon Charo Mramba, MCA for Kakuyuni and not Mgogo Mr. Speaker. That name Mgogo is an *alias* and it should remain outside the Chamber.

Hon. Kadenge: Pengine nimesahau lakini kuongezea lile jina lingine ambao aliniambia, jina lake ni *Mgogo wa ache*, nilikuwa nimewacha hilo jina lengine kwa hivyo pole mheshimiwa Mgogo lakini nakuomba tuendelee na huu Mjadala. Nawaomba waheshimiwa wenzangu huu Mjadala ambao uko mbele yetu ni muhimu na sio muhimu kwa Kamati ya uchumi pekee...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Kindly go to the core business of the debate.

Hon. Kadenge: Nawaomba waheshimiwa tuunge mkono huu Mswada; tumechelewesha. Tuliingia hapa kutokana na kura zetu kutoka kwa Wadi tukisema tutaelimisha vijana na kufikia sasa asilimia ya vijana walioelimishwa ni 0.1. Kwa hivyo, naomba tupitische huu Mswada ili wananchi wetu wafaidike. Pole sana Mgogo na nakuomba pia wewe ulete ile *affidavit* yako ya *Mgogo wa ache* ili tuendelee.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much hon. Members. The Kilifi County Investment Corporation and Development Bill, 2019 has gone through the Second Reading and hon. Members have had an opportunity to make their contributions.

(Question put and agreed to)
