NOTICE OF MOTION

COMPENSATION OF LAND ADJUDICATION COMMITTEES SET UP IN WARDS

Hon. (Ms.) Ngala: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am here standing on behalf of hon. Tuva Pascal to move a notice of Motion to the County Executive Member in charge of the Department of Lands, Energy and Physical Planning.

Aware that, the provisions of the Fourth Schedule part of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, provides that County Planning and Development which includes Land Survey and Mapping, Boundaries and Fencing are devolved functions.

Aware that, there are Land adjudication Committees formed during every adjudication exercise. Aware that, the process of land adjudication and demarcation is tedious and hectic. Noting with concern that, these Land adjudication Committees previously formed have been working without any remuneration from the County Government. Appreciating that, there is need for the Land Adjudication Committees, the County Department of Lands and County Management Board to work closely for the benefit of the resident of Kilifi County.

MOTION

ADOPTION OF THE REPORT OF THE BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE ON THE KILIFI COUNTY FISCAL STRATEGY PAPER, 2016

Hon. Mangi: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I rise to move that this House adopts the Report of the Budget and Appropriation Committee on the Kilifi County Fiscal Strategy Paper, 2016 laid on the table on Monday, 14th March. I call upon hon. Onesmus Gambo Karisa to second the adoption of this Report.

(Hon. Gambo stood at his place to second)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Thank you very much. Hon. Members, the Chairperson for Budget and Appropriations Committee has moved a Motion and which has subsequently been seconded by hon. Gambo, the Chairperson for Agriculture and is now ready for debate.

(Question proposed)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Yes hon. Gambo.

Hon. Gambo: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I hereby stand to support the adoption of this Report. We understand that for anything to move forward in this County, there should be a Strategic Plan to be made. Legally, the Committee had to sit and collect views from different departments as well as from the Whole House. The Committee sat and got all the contributions from different Committees which have enabled us to pave way for the strategic plan for the development of this County. Upon adopting this Report, it will enable this County to create a way forward for its development.

In this Report, it had made the Committee on Education or the Committee on ECD to sit and even see what has been amended and the laws that have been put there of which will make the Committee make scope changes to the funds to be allocated for our children and the scholarship. Upon adopting this Report as well, it will increase the Ward Development Fund for the development of our Wards from what we have now to more. On increasing these funds, the Committee or the Ward Representatives have seen how important these funds are to our Wards thus have made the Committee on Budget and Appropriations to sit and make a Strategy of increasing these funds to the level where the development in the Wards will be seen as growing very fast. Mr. Speaker, Sir, I stand to support the adoption of this Report. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Hassan.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. (Dr.) Chitibwi.

Hon. (Dr.) Chitibwi: Thank you very much Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand to support the adoption of this Report for the Strategy Paper. I wish to commend this House and in particular the Committee leading in this subject. Over the last three years, you have all become knowledgeable in the process of budgeting for this County. Initially, we were just onlookers and rubber stumbers. There were very little consultations in the early stages and we have all seen what has happened. Things that were planned for the first financial year of devolution some of them upto today are still in problems. Where *wananchi* were involved and this Assembly was fully involved was the last financial year and we have seen changes in the communication rate. I believe, if this continues with the participation of the Assembly and these consultations that have gone in making this budget at this stage, we are going to achieve what this County aspires.

Mr. Speaker, earlier on there was some misconception that the Executive lead by the Governor is saying one way and this Assembly said the other way. This has been brought about by some of our officers to the victims but we know what the Governor pledged to do. We know what his manifesto was saying and although we are in different parties in this House, we have all tried our best to make sure that the Governor succeeds. We also appreciate that we also have made promises to our electorate and we have repeatedly said he is going to support each and every one of us to achieve what he has promised. This particular stage of the budget we have supported his Excellency the Governor and I hope no one is going to derail these efforts. I support the adoption and I request other Members to also support the adoption. Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Yes Hon. Nzaro.

Hon. Nzaro: Thank you Mr. Speaker. May I also take this opportunity to rise in support of this Report. In fact I also want to congratulate the Speaker who has made it possible that this debate should be done in this afternoon session because it was supposed to have been done in the morning but because we had no quorum in the Assembly, it was through the able work of the House Business Committee that sat on a very serious note in the morning to make sure that this Report comes on the floor of the Assembly so that we are not time barred.

Mr. Speaker, Article 107 of the Public Finance Management Act demands that we make sure that we have programmes which adhere to make this County run its affairs in a very prudent

and financial discipline. Mr. Speaker, this Strategy Paper gives us an outline of how the County is supposed to spend and raise its revenues. When I was looking at this Report, I found very interesting things. If you look at the Department of Education, you will find that there is a programme which is to be initiated in this County which is the School Feeding Programme and I think the residents and the youths of this County will be happy to see these things come to vision.

Mr. Speaker, if you look at our County in general, we have several areas where it is semi arid and this County has been classified so. The issues which are being addressed in this Strategy Paper if you look at what is happening, there are those programmes which are initiated to make sure that there is food security in this County. Issues of drip irrigation have been highlighted in this Report and I think we are going the right direction so that our people in this County get the right quantities of food on the table.

Mr. Speaker, if you look at the environment, it has been reflected for example in the place where I come from (Ganze). You will find a lot of deforestation is being done but the initiative taken by this Government through this County Fiscal Strategy Paper you will see that, there are programmes which are initiated to reduce deforestation; for example the issue of bio-gas kits has been highlighted in this Paper. So, I think this Paper is very exemplary and I urge the Members to support it and also recommend the Executive because through this Paper we are also trying to achieve Vision 2030 which is efficient in our Country. With those few remarks Mr. Speaker, I wish to support. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu.

Hon. (Ms.) Mbeyu: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I rise to support the adoption of this Report. I think this is the right time for this document to be accepted and reach the destination in good time. All the other Members, being one of the Members of the Budget Committee, we have gone through this document and this is the right time that all the other Members support the adoption of this document so that they are in line with the strategy. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Nzaka.

Hon. Nzaka: Thank you Mr. Speaker for giving me this chance. It will be a sin if I will not appreciate the work of the able Chairperson. He has done a good job and the entire Committee. Mr. Speaker, Sir, budget making is a continuous process and it has its timelines. As per the PFM (Public Finance Management) Act, we should be done with this document as soon as possible so that budget process can continue as per the timeline. Mr. Speaker, Sir I would like to congratulate the Members for the adoption of this Report because it has touched all the departments; for example as I am the Chairperson of Education there are some projects which are initiated in this document. We are taking care of the consumption of the ECD (Early Childhood Education) Centres. In this document in the Department of Education we are seeing even the feeding programme has also been touched and we are going to employ polytechnic teachers which is a plus to this County.

Mr. Speaker, Sir, when we look at the Department of Health, we are seeing our young mothers dying often because of lack of health facilities, but once you look at this document we are going to improve the health facilities. This document is going to allow us to make a good budget for this County. It is in line with the CIDP (County Integrated Development Plan) where all the projects which are here are being captured where this House passed the previous time. Mr. Speaker, I urge my fellow hon. Members to adopt this Report so that we can allow the budget making process. Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

Hon. Mangi: Mr. Speaker, Sir, let me take this opportunity to thank hon. Members for supporting this document. Mr. Speaker, Sir, let me give the difference between the County Fiscal Strategy Paper and the Budget expense. Mr. Speaker, the County Fiscal Strategy Paper is a guideline towards the main budget making process. It highlights on the areas which have to be considered when the real budget making will be in process.

I will just go to one area where we have addressed as a County Assembly or County Government about the revenue collection. All along since the County Governments came in force, never have we achieved the anticipated revenue collection targets. This is an area where all stakeholders in revenue collection should urgently meet and see how well they can address the challenges facing revenue collection in our County. Mr. Speaker, we have all along been depending on National funds.

This is a very tricky situation because we should first of all be independent as regards to local revenue collection if we have to be serious in making allocations within our County but not only depending on the national government funds. Mr. Speaker, the passage of this County Fiscal Strategy Paper will legalize the budget making process hence the Controller of Budget cannot release funds if the County Fiscal Strategy Paper is not very good in the records. It is very prudent and mandatory that we ensure that all requirements that are within the budget making process are strictly approved within the budget timelines.

Last but not least Mr. Speaker, I will urge the Executive to respect budget timelines. It is sad to note that all along, the Executive has been bringing documents to the County Assembly on the last day; not only on the last day but the last minute. I trust that they will understand and bring the main budget maybe five days before 30th April timeline so that we may have enough time to peruse, deliberate and go round the whole County to get the public views so that it becomes easier for us to pass this document. With those few words, I thank hon. Members and I request them to join me in the last approval as you will put the question at the end.

Hon. Muhambi: Thank you Madam Chairperson. I beg to move that; Clause 5 of the Bill be amended by deleting Clause 5(1)(a)(b) ; and inserting the following words after the word Management appearing in Clause 5 (1)(f) “as the Chairperson”.

Procedure in Committee of the Whole County Assembly on a Bill; “The Clerk shall call severally each part of the Bill in the sequence specified in Standing Order (123) (*sequence to be observed on a Bill in a Committee*) and if no amendments are proposed or when all proposed amendments have been disposed off, the Chairperson shall propose the question “that (as amended) stand part of the Bill” and, when Members who wish to speak have spoken, the Chairperson shall put that question to the Committee for decision”. It does not talk of having to read the whole amendment again. Can we continue.

Kiraga, let us look at the Standing Order 125(2) it says; No amendment shall be moved to any part of the Bill by any Member other than a Member in charge of the Bill, unless written notification of the amendment shall have been given to the Clerk twenty-four hours before the commencement of the sitting at which that part of the Bill is considered in Committee. Yes Hon. Kiraga.

Hon. Kiraga: Thank you very much Hon. Chairperson, but what is the purpose of us sitting or discussing in the Committee of the whole House, if we are not allowed to do anything as far as this document is concerned?
