MOTION

**ADOPTION OF THE AUDIT REPORT ON THE FIVE DEFUNCT LOCAL AUTHORITIES
IN KILIFI**

Hon. Kaingu: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, Sir, on behalf of the County Public Investments and Accounts Committee, I wish to move the following Motion as follows;

THAT, This House adopts the County Public Investments and Accounts Committee Audit Report of the five defunct local authorities in Kilifi laid on the table of the House on Wednesday, 21st October, 2015.

I call upon hon. Alphonse Mwayaa to second this Motion.

(Hon. Mwayaa stood at his place and bowed to second the Motion)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Members, the Motion as tabled is ready for debate. Hon. Matsaki.

MOTION FOR ADJOURNMENT UNDER STANDING ORDER 50(b)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Nixon Mramba.

Hon. Mramba: Mr. Speaker I am standing on Point of Order number 50 (b) that we seek adjournment of this debate to a later date to give enough time for Members to go through the Report and make an informed decision. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Who is seconding that?

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(Hon. Hamza stood at his place and bowed to second the Motion)

Yes hon. Hamza is seconding. Hon. Members, the Standing Order that hon. Nixon Mramba has pointed out is a Motion that does not require a Notice. It is now ready for Members to debate on whether this Motion to adopt the Audit Report is to be adjourned until later when the House Business Committee recommends the appropriate time so that Members can have ample time to analyze it. Hon. Pascal Thuva Jacob.

Hon. Pascal: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir, for giving me an opportunity to contribute towards the deferment Motion that has been brought about by hon. Nixon Mramba. Mr. Speaker, we all understand that this Report is in regard to five defunct local authorities and the voluminous report that is before us should get enough time for Members to articulate all the issues that have been pointed out in this report.

Taking into account the busy schedule that we have as Members, I believe we have not had enough time for us to go through the Report. I went through a bit of the Report and I need more time to at least to go through all the details of the report so that when we sit and discuss about the Report then we are seen to be discussing from an informed position. So I stand to support the deferment of the discussion of the report before the House. Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. (Ms.) Arafa.

Hon. (Ms.) Arafa: Thank you very much Mr. Speaker, Sir for giving me this opportunity to contribute to this adjournment Motion. I agree with hon. Nixon Mramba and I am sure most of the Members who are in this House will also agree with him.

This is the second largest Report we have ever had in this House; the first being the Ad Hoc Committee Report and this is the second one. It is very voluminous. Since the Report was tabled in this House, most of the Members have been going up and down in their respective Wards on the issue of El-Niño. This has been a challenge and it is good that this House shows seriousness in that we want to work on things that we are sure of, things that will remain good products for Kilifi County.

I have been trying to read this report and I have so far read a quarter of it up to the proposed completion of Kibokoni Market and I need like a week or two to read the remaining part. I urge Members to support the adjournment Motion and also take time to read the Report and understand it well. We will be starting our long recess on Wednesday, I am sure that we will set time for this House before we come back in February so that we can come during the long recess and pass this Report. Thank you very much Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand to support the adjournment Motion.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Hamza.

Hon. Hamza: Asante sana Bw. Spika. Nami pia naunga mkono Hoja ile ambayo imependekezwa na Mheshimiwa Nixon Mramba kuwa tuahairishe Mjadala huu mpaka wakati mwengine na langu la kuchangia ni kwamba ukiangalia nakala zile ambazo tuko nazo hapa ni kwamba hiki ni kitabu kikubwa sana ambacho yale maswala ambayo yako ndani yanahusiana na fedha na ni muhimu sana tupate wakati maanake pia inatakikana tuwe na kikao maalum mahali fulani ambapo tutapata wataalamu ambao watatuelekeza vizuri.

Yale maswala yaliyomo ndani si maswala tu ya kuja hapa na kuyapitisha; ni maswala ambayo yanahitaji mtaalamu ndio hata sisi pia tuwe mahali ambapo tunaweza kukaa na tukazungumza na tukajadiliana kwa undani na hivyo basi tuwe pia tuko nje ya maeneo ya Kaunti ya Kilifi ili tuweze kukaa mahali kando tuzungumze, tujadiliane vizuri ili tukija hapa tuwe na

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ufasaha wa kutosha kuhusu yale ambayo yako pale ndani ili tukichangia tunachangia kwa kina kizuri Bw. Spika. Asante sana.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Members, allow me to call upon the Mover to respond so that we can conclude this Motion.

(Question, that the Mover be now called upon to reply, put and agreed to)

Hon. Mramba, please.

Hon. Mramba: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wish to move as follows; that due to the political scenario especially in Malindi now that hon. Dan Kazungu has been elevated to the position of CS (Cabinet Secretary), there has been a campaign mood in Malindi and I believe in Kilifi County in general. We are going into a by-election very soon; we have not had time to go through that Report. Therefore, we need enough time so that we can call a *Kamkunji*, we iron out some other things, we be taken through by an expert as hon. Hamza has suggested, an expert in the field of Accounts and Economics so that we can come back to the House with an informed mind Mr. Speaker.

I wish to thank all hon. Members who have supported this Motion and even those who did not have time to contribute to this Motion so that it is deferred to a later date; we have a meeting even if it is in the middle of the recess. We can be called for a Special session in a place like Mombasa or anywhere in this country where we shall have peace of mind; we deliberate on this Report so that when we come back to the House we shall be able to debate it conclusively. Thank you so much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Mwambire): Hon. Members, allow me to put the question to the deferment Motion.
