NOTICES OF MOTIONS

ESTABLISHING THREE COUNTY REHABILITATION CENTRE

The Speaker (Hon. Kahindi): Yes who is holding brief? Press the intervention button please?

Hon. (Ms.) Nuzla: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. On behalf of hon. Hadad Feiswal Almas, I wish to move a Motion to the Department of Gender, Social Services, Culture and Sports:-

THAT, aware that drug abuse is one of the biggest problems confronting Kilifi especially the youth.

AWARE THAT, incidents of drug and alcohol abuse and related anti-social behaviors have increased in recent years.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, there isn't a single rehabilitation centre operationalized by the County Government.

NOTING WITH CONCERN THAT, the lack of a county operated rehabilitation centre has caused many youths to be unable to access counseling and recovery services.

This House urges the County Executive Committee Member in charge of Gender, Social Services, Culture and Sports to initiate measures for establishing three county rehabilitation centres at Mtwapa, Kilifi Town and Malindi.

ILLEGAL APPOINTMENT OF FIVE CHIEF OFFICERS

Hon. Matsaki: Mr. Speaker, Sir. I stand in for hon. George Baya, MCA Watamu Ward. This Notice of Motion is directed to the County Secretary on illegal appointment of five Chief Officers:-

THAT, aware that Section 45 (1) of the County Governments Act, 2012, provides that the Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced county Chief Officers from among persons

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competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board and with the approval of the county assembly, appoint county chief officers.

AWARE THAT, Section 45(5) of the County Governments Act, 2012, provides that the Governor may re-assign a county chief officer.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, provides that an appointment under the Constitution or any other written law for which the approval of the county assembly is required shall not be made unless the appointment is approved or deemed to have been approved by the County Assembly in accordance with that Act.

NOTING WITH CONCERN THAT, the Governor issued appointment letters to five Chief Officers contrary to the provisions of the County Governments Act, 2012, and the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

This House urges the County Governor through the County Secretary to immediately revoke the appointments and submit the five nominees for vetting and approval by the County Assembly.
