AMENDMENT MOTIONS

REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS ON THE ANNUAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN (ADP)

Hon. Chiriba: Thank you hon. Speaker for giving me this opportunity. In support of this Report, I wish to give Notice to move an amendment to the Report of the Budget and Appropriations committee on the Annual Development Plan (ADP) FY 2019/2020 which was laid on Wednesday 23rd January, 2019. That the recommendations of the Report should include the following:-

That, the estimated cost of the Capital Programme named Construction of ECD Centres be reduced from Ksh. 200 M to Ksh. 85 M. That, a new programme with project name Employment of ECD Caregivers be introduced at an estimated cost of Ksh. 115 M. That, 100 Million allocated to construction of hostels be allocated to buying modern equipment in all the 39 youth polytechnics and construction of classes and toilets. That, out of the three business incubation centres with an estimated cost of 1.5 billion in the ADP, the department should fund one business incubation centre as a pilot project of the department as they look for development partners. On the same, allow me to call upon hon....

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Order, order hon. Member; remember you are the seconder on the principle Motion. For us to be diverted to the amendment then you are supposed to stand on a point of order so that you introduce the amendments.

Hon. Chiriba: I beg you give me some few minutes, if allowed

(Hon. Chiriba consults with the Clerk-at-the-Table)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Okay, the chairperson health.

Hon. Thaura: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wish to move amendments to the Report of

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The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Kindly be guided ...order Members. I think the clerks have been able to guide you so that you know the right procedures that you are suppose to follow; just consult the clerks. Chairperson Agriculture please proceed.

Hon. Noordin: I am standing on a point of order. I wish to give a Notice of amendment to the Report of the Budget and Appropriations committee on the Annual Development Plan (ADP) FY 2019/2020 which was laid on the Table of this House on Wednesday 23rd January, 2019.

That the Report is amended by inserting the following recommendations:-

THAT, the project dubbed local poultry development in Rabai, Kaloleni, Ganze, Malindi and Magarini sub-counties be amended as below; the sub-counties to include Kilifi North and Kilifi South, the targets of the project be increased to 5000, the performance indicators of the projects be amended by deleting the number "24" and replacing thereof with the number "35" and that the estimated cost of the project be amended by deleting the sum of Ksh. 2.5 M and inserting the sum of Ksh. 12.5 M.

THAT, the project named complete construction of Bamba, Marafa and Ganze milk schemes be amended by reducing its estimated cost to Ksh. 30 M from Ksh. 42 M. THAT, new project with their estimated cost be introduced under the division of livestock as below:- Bamba livestock sales yard at an estimated cost of Ksh. 6.M, Vipingo slaughter House at an estimated cost of Ksh. 2.7 M, Langobaya livestock sales yard at an estimated cost of Ksh. 3.3 M and Honey extractor machine at an estimated cost of Ksh. 30 M.

THAT, new programmes with their estimated cost be introduced under the division of fisheries as below; Purchase of fishing trawler for Mtwapa BMU at an estimated cost of Ksh. 30M, Fencing and gating of Mtwapa landing site at an estimated cost of Ksh. 10M, Estimated of sea weeds farming at Kinyaole Mto wa Mawe at an estimated cost Ksh. 10 M and Kanamai Mari-culture at an estimated cost of Ksh. 10 M.

THAT, the estimated cost of the programme named purchase of surveillance boats (8 BMUs) be increased from Ksh. 16 M to Ksh. 40 M.

THAT, the estimated cost of the programme named purchase of surveillance boats (Malindi and Kilifi) be increase to Ksh. 42 M from 34 M.

THAT, the programme named rehabilitation of fish ponds (5 Kilifi south, 7 Rabai, 4 Ganze, 2 Magarini, 2 Kilifi North) be amended by included Kaloleni and Malindi sub- counties and further amending the number of ponds to 5 per sub county and the estimated cost to be increased from Ksh. 10 M to Ksh. 15 M. I wish to call upon hon. Mwambire to second.

(Hon. Mwambire seconded)

(Question of the amendment proposed)

Hon. Mwambire: Thank you very much Mr. Speaker, Sir. I am standing to put some few inputs on the amendments as earlier put on by the chairperson for Agriculture on the Notice of Amendment of the Report of the Select Committee on Budget and Appropriation on the Annual Development Plan (ADP) 2019/2020.

I would like to support the amendment in reference to the proposed ADP which was earlier highlighting issues in terms of the livestock project which was not allocated or which was not mentioned in the ADP on the Bamba Livestock sales yard which had no allocation. The Committee went ahead and allocated Ksh.6 million to reinstate the project of livestock sales yard. Another thing which was also amended was the allocation of Ksh.42 million for Bamba,

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Marafa and Ganze milk scheme which was reduced to Ksh. 30 million and the other Ksh.12 million was allocated to support other projects. So, I stand to support the Motion for the Budget and Appropriation Committee and also urge this House to support these amendments for the ADP 2019/2020. Thank you.

Hon. Mumba: Asante mheshimiwa Spika. Nasikia furaha pia kwa kuweza kunipatia muda nami niweze kuchangia mabadiliko katika huu Mswada wa kifedha na mipangalio katika mwaka huu wa 2019/2020. Nataka niseme kwamba mimi nikiwa mwanakamati katika Kamati ile ya Kilimo na Ufugaji, tulikuwa na kipindi kizuri sana katika kupitia ile mikakati yote iliyoko katika mwaka huo wa kifedha na kwa wale maafisaa kutoka serikali yetu ya Kaunti tuliweza kukaa chini na kukadiria maswala haya yote kwa kina ndio maana tukaweza kuafikiana kwamba tuweze kufanya haya mabadiliko.

Kwa hivyo, ni ombi langu kwamba wajumbe wenzangu tutaweza kuyahakiki mabadiliko haya na tuweze kuona kwamba yanapitishwa ili yakaweze kuwa ya manufaa, sio kwa Wadi yangu bali kwa Kaunti nzima ya Kilifi. Ukitazama kuna mambo mengine ambayo yalikuwa yamepangwa pale ambayo yamefanyika katika Wilaya tofauti tofauti lakini sisi kama kamati tuliweza kuafikiana kwamba yasiweze kufanywa katika njia ya ubaguzi ila kila wilaya iweze kufikiwa na miradi ile kwa sababu inalenga wananchi wote wa Kilifi ndio maana tukaweza pia kuhakikisha ya kwamba wilaya zote zimeweza kufikiwa kimaendeleo.

Ni jambo ambalo tumeona ya kwamba litakapotiliwa manani na tutakapoungana sisi kama wajumbe na tuseme kwamba nivyema liweze kupitishwa basi litakuwa kwa manufaa kwetu sote na kwa wakaazi wote wa Kilifi Kaunti. Kwa hivyo nawasihi wajumbe wenzangu, kupitia kwa ile hekima ya Kamati ya Kilimo, Uvuvi na Ufugaji, tuweze kuunga mkono mabadiliko haya na tuweze kusonga mbele kama Kilifi Kaunti. Kwa hayo mengi yenye hekima na yaliyotoka katika kinywa cha Mjumbe wa Tezo naomba kukomea hapo na niseme ya kwamba naunga mkono. Asanteni.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Proceed, the Member for Gongoni; you had made your request.

Hon. Kiraga: Thank you so much Mr. Speaker. I also wish to register my appreciation to the Committee on Agriculture for the amendments they have moved to this House. Thank you, so much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much hon. Members. Hon. Members, the amendment Motion as moved by the Chairperson Agriculture and proposed by the Member for Bamba has been debated by Members.

(Question put and agreed to)

The Chairperson, Health?

Hon. Thaura: Mr. Speaker, I stand on a Point of Order. I wish to move amendments of the Report on Budget and Appropriation Committee on the ADP, THAT; One; The project dubbed supply of equipments to Mariakani Hospital with an estimated cost of Ksh.1000, 000,000 be deleted. Two: All capital in the ADP under the Department of Health which are indicated as 90% or over complete in the status column be deleted forthwith. May I ask the hon. Member for Gongoni to second.

(Hon. Kiraga seconded)

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The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. It is very much in order but you see you are introducing amendments you should at least read them out so that you are able to lobby and make sure that Members are in support of what you are saying. You should at least talk about the amendments you are introducing otherwise...

Hon. Thaura: I so hope that my Membership actually know what they are...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you, an amendment Motion has been moved by the Chairperson, Health Services and the same has been seconded by the Member for Gongoni Ward.

Question put and agreed to)

Hon. Kiraga: Thank you so much Mr. Speaker, the amendments given by the Health Committee are justifiable and I will wish to highlight one of the amendment i.e. amendment number two in the Report. If you take a look at the Annual Development Plan in the Health Department they had projected some projects which as a Department felt that they will not be completed in this financial year and therefore they had projected those projects to be completed in the next financial year that is 2019/2020.

Mr. Speaker, some of the projects are even 90% complete as a committee we were wondering that we are in the second month of the third quarter of this current financial year and we are wondering if a project is 90% complete does it mean that the Department cannot complete that project within the rest full quarter ahead of us. We felt as a committee that these projects should be completed and there was no need to revote them to the next financial year. Therefore, I feel the amendments given by the Health Committee of which I am also a Member are valid. I now wish to ask the hon. Members to agree with the Health Committees recommendations as put by the Committee. Thank you very much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. (Ms.) Mary Maneno.

Hon. (Ms.) Maneno: Asante sana Bw. Spika na mimi pia nimesimama kuunga mkono marekebisho ya ripoti ya Kamati ya Afya hasa ile ya kwanza ambayo ni kuweka vifaa katika hospitali ya Mariakani. Kulingana na ile "Annual Development Plan" hospitali hii ilikuwa imewekewa pesa mara mbili lakini walikuwa wameweka na maana tofauti nitaitamka kwa kizungu. Ya kwanza walikuwa wanasema ya kwamba katika hiyo *Annual Development Plan* ni kwamba *they are equipping Mariakani hospital* na ile nyingine wameandika to *supply equipment*. Hivyo basi tukaona hakuna tofauti yoyote; hizi ni pesa za mwananchi na ni lazima mradi mmoja utolewe na ubaki mmoja. Kamati iliamua tukiwa na mkutano pamoja na Waziri na *chief officers*. Kwa hivyo hizo pesa zingepotea kwa mikono ya watu baada ya manufaa ya wakaazi wa Kilifi. Asante sana bw. Spika.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Tezo

Hon. Mumba: Thank you Mr. Speaker, and as a Member of the Health Committee, the amendments that have been moved by the Chairperson were only two which the Member for Gongoni has tried to highlight and hon. (Ms.) Maneno has done the same thing. I do not want to labour much on the same because that is what the findings are for the Committee of Health and I am in concurrence with whatever has been said and I am in support of the amendments and I want to urge my fellow Members to also embrace the amendments so we can also save what was due to be misused.

This is because if you can allocate a project with different names that means the funds can be misused and in the wisdom of the committee we were in position to reject such kind of a

practice. So I think it is very much in order for the Members to support this amendment so that we can proceed. Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand to support.

(Question put and agreed to)

Hon. Chiriba: Thank you again Mr. Speaker for this opportunity accorded to me. I am rising on point of order number 53 to move some amendments. I wish to move an amendment to the Report of the Budget and Appropriations Committee on the Annual Development Plan 2019/2020 and this majorly focuses on pre-primary education and vocational training.

Before I call upon hon. (Ms) Saumu Sidi to second allow me to make some few submissions; the Committee on Pre-primary Education which is an extension of this House had time interrogating the CEC Member for some clarities and you will find that we saw some projections in the Department which the Committee came up with some few proposals.

Citing an example; there was an estimate of capital programmes which was out to cost an estimate of Ksh. 200 million and the committee in its wisdom found it fit to reduce it to Ksh. 85 M so that we can also introduce or take care of the caregivers instead. So it is my prayer that this honourable House will consider and approve these changes.

There was also a programme on building hostels which the Committee in its wisdom saw it fit that we need more of the modern equipment in these youth polytechnic centres rather than the hostels.

The Department also had a projection of coming up with three incubation centres at the cost of Ksh. 1.5 million while the committee found it fit to introduce some changes and directed that we can have one incubation centre that can serve as a model programme. With those few remarks allow me to call upon hon. (Ms) Sidi to second.

(Hon. (Ms) Sidi seconded)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you hon. Members, again an amendment Motion has been moved by the chairperson; pre-primary and vocational training committee and seconded by a Member of the committee hon. (Ms) Saumu Sidi.

(Question of the amendment proposed)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Kindly make your requests, yes, Hon. (Ms.) Sidi.

Hon. (Ms.) Sidi: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also rise to support the Motion as a Member of the Committee on pre-primary and vocational training. I would like to be in line with the chairperson and avoid repeating what he has said. He has already highlighted all the four points that the committee wanted to make amendments on and I am just urging my fellow hon. Members to support this. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Hon. Jana, kindly proceed.

Hon. Jana. Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir. I am here to support what is in the committee's recommendation. Thank you very much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Tezo.

Hon. Mumba: Mr. Speaker, once again thank you for this opportunity and I appreciate because whenever I request, you give me the opportunity. I am not a Member of that committee but I must say that I am impressed. I am impressed in the sense that, we as the House passed a

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Motion here putting in consideration of the care givers. I remember Mr. Speaker, you engineered that Motion and the committee sat and found it fit that they should allocate money for the same. I just want to congratulate the committee for this good job that they have done and I stand to support. Thank you very much Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Honourable Members, the Motion as moved by chair pre-primary and vocational training and seconded by Hon. Sidi has been debated by members.

(Question, that the words to be added be added, put and agreed to)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The committee on Labour, Chairperson.

Hon. Kadenge: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand on Point of Order number (53).

I wish to give notice to move an amendment on the Report of the Budget and Appropriations committee on the Annual Development Plan (ADP) financial year 2019/2020 which was laid on Wednesday 23rd January 2019 and the recommendations of the Report include the following: - The office of the governor, (1) That, the Ksh. 3 Million from capital projects allocated for renovations of the Governor's office be effected and changed to up to Ksh. 5.5 million. (2) The Ksh. 3 Million from capital projects for the refurbishment of the Deputy Governor's office be effected to the change of up to Ksh. 7.5 million. (3) There should be an inclusion of Ksh. 10 Million for the non-capital project allocation towards inter-governmental relations. (4) There should be an inclusion of Ksh. 20 Million for non-capital projects towards enhancing the donation kit.

(5) Mr. Speaker sir, we also have the department of devolution, public service and disaster management which should have an inclusion of Ksh. 206 Million for non-capital projects towards the relief fund. (6) That, there should be an inclusion of Ksh. 7 Million for non-capital projects towards the purchase of three rescue boats and equipment. (7) That, Ksh. 3.5 Million from capital projects allocated for construction of the Administration's Office toilets be effected with a change of Ksh. 4.8 Million.

Mr. Speaker sir, before I call upon the Hon. Member for Mwanamwinga ward (Hon. Pascal) to support, allow me to make some few remarks. I will start with the renovations of the Governor's office; the increment was due to the installation of the air condition and the construction of an emergency exit at the office. There also should be a waiting lounge area to be fitted with an automated system.

Mr. Speaker Sir, in the department of devolution I have highlighted some changes and this is due to the increase in the disaster and the flooding as experienced in Kakuyuni ward, Jilore ward, Magarini and Ganda wards. Also in addition of the Ksh. 70 Million to purchase the three rescue boats; this increment was due to the purchase of the boats in Malindi, Mtwapa and Watamu and all this was inclusive of the equipment needed alongside purchasing the boat. With these few remarks let me call upon the Hon. Member for Mwanamwinga hon. Pascal to support the amendments. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much.

(Hon. Pascal seconded)

(Question of the amendment proposed)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Pascal.

Hon. Pascal: Thank you Mr. Speaker, for giving me this opportunity to also support the amendments that are before this House. Mr. Speaker, the chair has actually analyzed everything; however there are a few issues that I would like to add more weight on, through my contribution.

Mr. Speaker, on the amendments of the relief food, as you have known, Kilifi has always experienced some drought and many families have been affected Mr. Speaker. It was therefore prudent for this committee to actually add on the relief food kitty so that we can assist the families that are suffering. We have seen people from Kakuyuni Ward, people in Kambi Ya Waya, people in Balaga and all those areas being affected by famine. So the enhancement of this kitty will go a long way in assisting the people of Kilifi.

Mr. Speaker, another very critical issue that will make me support this is the enhancement of the disaster management fund. When we discussed this we were very categorical that when we are using this kitty we ensure that every Kilifian who is affected is assisted with this money. Therefore Mr. Speaker, since the other points have already been elaborated, I wish to call the hon. Members to actually move along with the Committee into supporting these amendments. Thank you very much Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Shaban

Hon. Shaban: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I also support the amendments which have been moved by our able chairperson hon. David Kadenge; MCA for Malindi town. Thank you very much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. (Ms.) Radhia Ali Omar

Hon. (Ms.) Radhia: Asante mheshimiwa Spika kwa kunipatia nafasi hii na mimi niweza kuunga mkono marekebisho ambayo tulikaa kama Kamati ya Leba na tukafanya na leo tuko hapa hatuna budi kuunga mkono. Kwa hivyo, nimesimama kuunga mkono merekebisho.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Jilore Ward

Hon. Chiriba: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I rise in support of the amendments moved by the hon. Member for Malindi Town Ward. Mr. Speaker, allow me to be of very few words and to say that I am impressed especially on the issue of increasing the allocation on disaster issue. You will agree with me Mr. Speaker that problems are inevitable; so in as much as we cannot invite problems, they will still come. So, having a good allocation also translates in readiness Mr. Speaker.

This County needs to be very much ready because what happened in Kakuyuni and Jilore as cited needed a really quick intervention and this cannot be if there are no funds allocated towards the same. We experienced change of some programmes through variations of funds; sometimes we had to remove funds from planned programmes in order to cater for the unplanned.

So, it is good for us to plan early and so I want to congratulate the Committee for finding it fit to have such like an allocation increase. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Kakuyuni Ward

Hon. Mramba: Asante sana mheshimiwa Spika. Mimi nimesimama kuunga mkono na kumpongeza mheshimiwa David Kadenge Dadu ambaye ni mwakilishi wa Wadi ya Malindi Mjini na ninaunga mkono mapendekezo yaliyopeanwa. Kwanza nikigusia ule mfuko wa mchango ama *donation* kwa kiingereza ni kweli kwamba huo mfuko kwa mara nyingi umekuwa ukiwekwa pesa kidogo na matatizo yamekuwa mengi kiasi kwa hivyo kile kiwango walichowekwa nakubaliana nacho ila tu ni kwamba kiwe na mpangilio wa uwazi kwa sababu

isiwekwe pesa ikalemea upande na kwengine ikawa *donation* hizo hazifiki; hapo haitaleti picha nzuri.

Zaidi ya hapo ni kwamba tukiongeza pesa hasa kwa majanga; tumeona kabisa kwamba hivi majuzi ambapo kulikuwa na janga hili la mafuriko kuna Wadi kadhaa ambazo zilitatizika sana ikiwemo Kakuyuni, hata hivi ninavyoongea Bw. Spika bado kuna watu karibu ishirini ama thelathini ambao wako kwenye kambi pale kwa ofisi ya chifu wa Goshi. Kwa hivyo, tumeona kabisa kwamba wakati mwingi tunapatikana wakati hatujajitayarisha manake mafuriko yakiingia ndio sasa tunaanza kutafuta senti huku na huku lakini tukiweka fungu ambalo linaweza kutusaidi na naamini hata mbeleni si vibaya tukinunua helikopta ya kaunti yetu ili tuone kwamba wakati kukiingia janga kama hili basi Gavana wetu na Mwenyekiti wetu wa Kamati hii waweze kuona hali na hata akiambiwa mheshimiwa wa Kakuyuni pia awemo kwenye helikopta pia si vibaya.

Hivyo basi zaidi ya hapo hilo pia litakuwa sio suluhisho zaidi; zaidi ni tuweze kuboresha yale maeneo ambayo yanaweza kuzalisha chakula yakipatiwa pesa za kutosha kwa sababu kuna maeneo kama yale ya Bamba na Ganze ambayo kwa mara nyingi yanahitaji msaada wa chakula. Tukijaribu kungalia mbinu ambazo zinaweza kuzalishwa chakula, na tukawasaidie wakizalisha chakula itatusaidia badala kwamba tununue mahindi tuwapelekee kama wanaweza wakazalisha chakula wao wenyewe wangesaidika kuliko kutegemea zile *ndude za morya* ama za msituni inakuwa si vizuri. Kwa hayo machache Bw. Spika, naomba kuunga mkono. Asante.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. The Leader of Minority

The Leader of Minority (Hon. Matsaki): Asante Bw. Spika. Mimi pia wacha nisimame kuunga mkono Ripoti hii na niseme tu kwamba kutoka kwa ofisi ya Gavana, yale yote ambayo yametajwa pale halafu tunarudi kwa mambo ya *disaster*... kusema kweli Kamati ilifanya jukumu kubwa hasa kupitia kwa mwenyekiti wake ambaye ni Mhesh. David Kadenge. Mheshimiwa Spika, haya mambo yanajirudia. Kama Kilifi Kaunti tumekuwa na shida nyingi na shida hizi tusipojipanga mapema basi tutapangwa na majanga yale ambayo yatakuwa yanakuja. Lakini kwa sababu pia mimi ni mmoja wa wale wamakamati, ni kwamba hayo yote kamati ilianguka na ikaona ni vizuri kuweka pesa nyingi kwa upende huo ili wakati kuna shida imetokea isiwe tu ni serikali inatafuta pesa kutoka wapi. Kwa hivyo, mimi tu ombi langu ni kuwa wale waheshimiwa wa bunge hili waweze kupitisha Ripoti hii ili kwamba wakati wowote tunapopata majanga pia tuweze kusaidika. Asante na nimesimama kuunga mkono.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Can we have the hon. Member for Ganda Ward to be the last one in this amendment Motion because I can see there is still a list and there is a lot of business that is pending. So, please...

Hon. Omar: Asante mheshimiwa Spika. Mheshimiwa Spika, nataka kwanza kumshukuru mwenyekiti wa Kamati ya Leba mheshimiwa Kadenge ambaye twamtarajia kwamba baada ya miaka mitano atakuwa Mbunge wetu wa Malindi kwa wazo lake zuri na la busara kuweza kifikiria maswala nyeti kama hayo. Ni kweli, sisi ambao tunatoka katika sehemu za mashambani tumeweza kuathirika kiasi kikubwa sana. Kama alivyosema mheshimiwa Mramba kuna baadhi ya watu mpaka sasa bado wako katika maofisi ya machifu wakitumia yale mahema. Hata kufikia leo kule kwangu Ganda kuna baadhi ya wale watu walioweza kupeana yale mahema kusaidia wale watu tangu mwaka jana mwezi wa tano mpaka leo wameenda kudai pesa zao ofisini Kilifi kwani hawajalipwa. Ni jambo la kusikitisha angalau kukiwa na mfuko kama huu twaamini kwamba mambo yatakuwa mazuri. Kwa hivyo nikimalizia nataka kuunga mkono uamuzi wa kamati ikiongozwa na baba yetu mheshimiwa Kadenge. Asante mheshimiwa Spika.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you.

(Question put and agreed to)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Chairperson for Roads kindly make your submissions.

Hon. Mwantsi: Thank you Mr. Speaker, for giving me the opportunity to address Members in regards to the changes that the Committee on Road and Transport came up with. I wish to give notice to move amendments to the Report of the select committee on Budget and Appropriations on the Annual Development Plan 2019/2020 which was laid on the Table of the House on Wednesday 23rd January, 2019

That, the Upgrading to bitumen standard of A7 (Barclays – Mtangani Prison Road) (Phase 1) Malindi be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 124 Million to KShs. 90 Million.

That, the Upgrading to bitumen standard of A7 (Mzambarauni/Mtwapa Health Centre) road (3KM) in Shimo La Tewa Ward be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 200 Million to KShs. 69 Million.

That, the Upgrading to bitumen standard of Kibao Cha Fundisa Rd (4KM) in Adu Ward be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 250 Million to KShs. 180 Million.

That, the Completion of the Upgrading to Cabro standard of A109 (Coast Palace – Bamba Rd) in Mariakani Ward (1KM) be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 60 Million to KShs. 45 Million.

That, the Completion of the Upgrading to Cabro Standard of Gongoni Centre (1KM) Rd in Gongoni Ward be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 60 Million to KShs. 45 Million.

That, the Construction and Rehabilitation of Malindi, Mtwapa and Kilifi storm water drainage works be amended by reducing the estimated cost from KShs. 150 Million to KShs. 90 Million.

That, the estimated cost for the Construction of a makeshift bridge at Jambiani Creek in Gongoni Ward be amended by reducing it from KShs. 150 million to KShs. 5 million

That, the Grading and rehabilitation of Retreat Road KwaSadaka to Mbewwau Rd in Mtepeni Ward be introduced as new project at an estimated cost of KShs. 8 Million

That, the Grading and murraming of Ngomeni Mabotini – Rasi Primary – Milimani Primary Rd (7.6KM) programme in Gongoni Ward at an amount of KShs. 20 Million be deleted and replaced with the Opening, Grading and murraming of Kizingo to Watamu to Gede Cottages (15KM) in Watamu Ward with the same estimated cost (KShs. 20 Million).

That, the estimated cost of the Upgrading to Bitumen standard of C11 via Ribe Girls to Kinunguna Junction be amended by reducing it from KShs. 240 Million to KShs. 160 Million.

That, the Grading and Gravelling of Timboni – AthumanBalami Rd be revised to KShs. 15 Million.

That, the estimated cost for the Improved road motoarability; construction of Bus Park at Kilifi be reduced from KShs. 120 Million to KShs. 100 Million

That, new projects be introduced into the Annual Development Plan for the Financial Year 2019/2020 as follow:-

- a) Bucket Truck for servicing street lights in Kilifi County at an estimated cost of KShs. 20 Million
- b) Opening and heavy murraming of Matsangoni to Mpenda Kula (6KM) Rd in Matsangoni Ward at an estimated cost of KShs. 12 Million

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- c) Grading, Gravelling and Culverts Rehabilitation of Marikebuni to Madzayani to Pumwani Rd in Magarini ward (15KM) at an estimated cost of Kshs. 20 Million
- d) Purchase of a Grader for Malindi Sub County at an estimated cost of Kshs. 45 Million
- e) Purchase of Two (2) Fire Engines for Kilifi and Malindi Towns at an estimated cost of Kshs.90 Million
- f) Tarmacking of the Malindi beach front road within Shela Ward that is 6 kilometers at a cost of 270 million.

Before I call the hon. Member to second me there are a few things that I will need to highlight to the Members. When the Annual Development Plan was introduced to the House there were some reservations which as a Committee we felt that they needed changes. Those reservations needed some extra amount that led us to introduce some of the few projects that we have listed here.

To begin with the people of Malindi that have in some many years depended on tourism have been wallowing in poverty because of tourism going down. One of the contributing factors of that dwindling in the tourism sector has been because of the poor roads along the beach. For that reason it resulted in a number of meetings that the stakeholders were having that lead to the reintroducing of the retarmacking of the beach front road from junction where we have the banks; that road is impassable. To improve tourism in Malindi as a whole then that road needs to be done and our investors will stop complaining.

I remember the other time the proprietor of the Billionaire Hotel was on TV accusing the County Government of Kilifi of inefficiency; not only him but many people have been complaining about the inability of the County Government of Kilifi in being sensitive to the plight of investors. That is the reason that we thought the amount of money that we saved we repair that road, so that if there are other issues that will dwindle tourism will not be because of the Department of Roads.

Secondly, we have been having issues regarding the tractors and graders that we have in the county. From the inception of this House there have been two sub-counties that have not been having graders. One has been Kilifi North and Malindi. For Kilifi North, it has been there physically but in reality it has not been there. Since we came in, the grader has been with the technical people for all those years and it has not been working. We thought it was prudent that we introduce it in our discussion and also reaffirming the early agreement we had at the Continental resort. Members ought to introduce either graders or bulldozers and that introduction was the results of the meeting we held.

The other issue is about the lights within our towns and that was because of poor service; many of the lights have not been on. Through the advice of the people who have been servicing the lights, these are what we call bucket truck. The bucket truck is like a... truck that carries *fundi* up while they are repairing the lights, instead of using the normal ladders. Kenya power people have them when you see Kenya Power working on the grid they use those ladders that are movable; we call them bucket trucks. Many other amendments as shown in the table. So I call hon. (Ms.)Victoria to second.

The Speaker (Hon Kenga): Thank you very much hon. Members. An amendment Motion has been moved by the chairperson Roads and seconded by hon. (Ms.) Victoria. I now propose the question that the Report of the budget and Appropriation committee on the annual developing plan for the financial year 2019,2020 be amended as moved by the chairperson Roads. Hon. (Ms.) Victoria make your request.

(Question Proposed)

Hon. (Ms.) Victoria: Thank you Mr. Speaker for giving me this opportunity to support the amendments as made by chairperson. The chairperson for Roads, Transport and Public Works has forwarded the correct amendment according to how some of our roads have been affected. As a committee, we sat and looked at various areas which have been affected and came up with these amendments which I stand to support fully as forwarded by the chairperson. Thank you.

The Speaker (Hon Kenga): Thank you for making those contributions. Yes Member for Mwanamwinga.

Hon Pascal: Thank you Mr. Speaker for this opportunity. I support the chairperson of the committee on the amendments and the fact behind my support is that, this is the only committee that has made a lot of savings because we can see that their recommendations are on reduction of the cost that has been indicated by the department. This is a positive indication; if we have estimates that are on a higher side this committee was able through communication with other partners to come down on many of the project. Another issue is on the purchase of graders and bulldozers; as a county we have always wanted to open up roads so that farmers in the interior can have access to goods roads and transport their produce to market places. So, if we do much on purchase on graders and bulldozers then we will be assisting our people.

Another issue which was touched by the committee is about the storm water drainage. I am calling upon the relevant committee to investigate on the drainage that has always been talked about. Mtwapa storm drainage channel has been there since we were councilors every time and then people talk of storm water drainage and money is put on that project but I do not know when this channel will end; it is always factored in the budget. As the committee has suggested that we reduce the money, we also go ahead and probably look into how this drainage channel keeps on appearing in subsequent budgets. I conclude Mr. Speaker by supporting the committee by the fact that they have also pointed out on further purchase of fire engines. The engines we have are not enough and therefore it is good that we go by the committee to get more fire engines for emergency. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker (Hon Kenga): The Member for Mariakani.

Hon. Kimosho: Asante Mheshimiwa Spika kwa kunipatia nafasi hii. Nasimama kuunga mkono kwa kazi hii nzuri iliyofanyika ya kamati ya barabara ikiongozwa na Mheshimiwa wetu Mwamtsi. Mimi sikuunga mkono tu bali wacha niseme ile kazi ya kamati ambayo tulifanya na pahali ambapo kidogo palinitia moyo zaidi ni kwamba Mheshimiwa Spika hata wewe ni shahidi nyumba ya mheshimiwa juzi ikichomeka pale Kilifi na hatukuwa na magari ya wazima moto. Ukiangalia hiyo namba kumi na tatu ambayo tumeweka magari ya kuzima moto mawili kwa upande wa Kilifi yatatusaidia lakini zaidi wacha nirudishe shukrani kubwa kwa kila mwanakamati kwa mchango wao na hata vile Mheshimiwa wa Mwanamwinga alivyosema hakika hii kamati kazi yake ni nzuri na mimi naunga mkono.

The Speaker (Hon Kenga): Hon. Mumba.

Hon Mumba: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I rise to support the amendment and in doing so I want to say that infrastructure is very key when we talk about development in any country either third world, second world and first world. I want to congratulate the committee for finding it fit that we reallocate the funds as it had been allocated initially. I still wonder because the allocation is unrealistic to me; I am not an engineer but I wonder if somebody can just sit and allocate a lot

of fund to projects that can be done with little funds that the committee can sit down and allocate the same funds.

We are passed that error, as a county... (*inaudible*) they can be guided to give the right projections for every project. It does not need for the committee to get that level of reallocating funds. I think that is too much for the committee, they have done well for instance the Mzambarauni road 3 kilometers has been allocated Ksh. 200,000,000 which is too much. That implies that every kilometer will be done to a tune of Kshs. 66.667million; that is too much. So, for the committee now to reduce the same, I think it was very much proper for it to be done like that. For example, like the other road for Fundisa a kilometre goes for Kshs.62.5 Million Mr. Speaker, so you wonder. In fact in my thinking although I am not an engineer, I expected the one for Fundisa now, to consume more because of the nature of the terrain as compared to Mzambarauni but you can see Mzambarauni is spending Kshs.66.66 Million while in Fundisa it is spending Kshs.62.5 Million.

This is very ridiculous and I must say; chairperson and your committee you did a very good job. Another thing that shocks me Mr. Speaker, how can you construct a make shift bridge at Jambiani to a tune of Kshs.150million! What are they trying to tell us? Now, is it the Committee that is leading the House or is it the Members that came up with these figures? Because from Kshs.150 to Kshs.5 Million? So I think we need to be guided well when coming up with these projections. We need to make sure monies are not misappropriated because of selfish gains or interests by a few who are intending to misuse the tax payer's money. So, with those many remarks Mr. Speaker, I beg to support that we adopt the amendments.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. (Ms.) Maneno?

Hon. (Ms.) Maneno: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I raise to support the amendments which have been submitted by the Chairperson Transport. Mr. Speaker, the chairperson has taken part of a teacher, he has elaborated very well the amendments and therefore I call upon this House to adopt these amendments to the ADP. Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): The Member for Kakuyuni

Hon. Mramba: Asante sana Bw. Spika, nami nimesimama kuunga mkono mapendekezo yaliyoletwa na mwenyekiti wa kamati hii mheshimiwa John Mwamtsi ambaye pia anatoka katika *marginalized community*

(*Laughter*)

Na huo ndio ukweli lakini ametufanyia kazi nzuri kwa sababu mheshimiwa Spika, kwa heshima barabara ya Adu kilomita nne zitengezwe kwa shilingi milioni mia mbili hamsini. Kwa kweli hata ingawa mimi si *engineer* kama alivyosema mheshimiwa mwenzangu lakini hata yule ambaye hakusoma kabisa ukimwambia kilomita nne zinaweza kuwekwa lami kwa shilingi milioni mia mbili hamsini, huo ni uongo wa wazi. Kwa sababu, wale ma *engineer* wanasema barabara ya lami, kilomita moja inaweza kutengewa kwa milioni arubaini ama arubaini na tano. Lakini hii mia mbili hamsini, bila shaka hawa maofisaa walikuwa wana malengo yao.

Kwa hivyo, nashukuru Bw. mwenyekiti pamoja na kamati yako kwa kazi mliyoifanya. Ninaloomba ni kwamba barabara ile ya *beach front* iweze kuwekwa lami kwa sababu imekuwa ikitatiza sana utalii hapa Malindi na licha ya utalii hata sisi wenyeji pia tumekuwa tukitatizika.

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Zaidi ya hapo ni kwamba kuna hii barabara ya kuelekea *Marine park*, kuenda mpaka *navy camp*, iko vibaya sana. Kwa hivyo, ningepomba kamati hii pia iweze kutembea kama kuna uwezekano *Supplementary Budget* ikija kuwekwa pesa hiyo pia ingekuwa bora maanake hiyo ndio barabara ambayo inaenda Marine Park, Billionaires Club, Lion in the Sun, mpaka nyumbani kwangu pia.

(Laughter)

Mheshimiwa Spika, hili tatizo la *ma-grader* limeleta taabu sana, kwa sababu gani nasema hivyo? *Ma-grader* yaliyokuja yaligawanywa ki-*Sub County* Malindi ikaambiwa imekosa. Kumbe *Kilifi North* nayo iko pale lakini ni mbovu na haijafanya kazi; la kushangaza ni kwamba sisi ambao Wadi zetu ziko kule mashambani tunaona kama tunaonewa. Kwa sababu gani? Kukija mradi wa barabara kuwekwa lami zinaangaliwa *town*, ile greda pia nayo inabaki *town* kulima barabara za Malindi *town* na Shela; kule Ganda na kule kwengine hazifiki na huo ndio ukweli ambao ni ukweli mtupu.

Sasa ikiwa lami zitawekwa *town*, hiyo greda pia angalau kufungua zile barabara kule mashambani, greda hazipatikani. Kwa hivyo, mheshimiwa mwenyekiti nakushukuru sana na ukiweza kupata vifaa kama hivi nako kule mashambani kuweze kufunguliwa. Hata Bajeti inayokuja pia nayo hata wale watu wa kule Madunguni nao wanahitaji kukanyaga lami pia sawa na watu wa Kisumu Ndogo, sawa na wale watu wengine ambao wanaishi huko mjini. Watu wa Jilore pia wana haki ya kukanyaga lami; si dhambi na wao wakiamka asubuhi wakianza kuja mjini wakanyaga lami, itakuwa ni vizuri zaidi. Kwa hayo mengi asante. Naunga mkono.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you the Member for Kakuyuni. This day you seem to drive the agenda for Malindi Constituency, is it because of the ambitions that you have? Hon. Dickson Shaban

Hon. Shaban: Asante mheshimiwa Spika. Mimi pia nimesimama kumuunga mkono ndugu yangu mheshimiwa John Mwamtsi ambaye sote tunatoka katika *marginalized community*. Mheshimiwa Spika, jambo ambalo limenifurahisha na hii kamati ni kwamba kila sehemu ya Kaunti hii imeguswa kuhusiana na mambo ya barabara.

Ukiangalia kwamba kuanzia Mtwapa, Malindi, Bamba hadi Magarini imezungumziwa; kwa hivyo wamegusa katika kila sehemu ya Kaunti kuhakikisha kwamba wananchi wa Kilifi wanapata barabara nzuri. Na pia nimeona barabara ambayo kamati pia wameinukuu; ile barabara ya Ribe Girls to Kinung'una *junction*.

Mheshimiwa Spika, hii ni barabara ambayo hutumika sana kama njia mbadala wakati njia kuu ya kutoka Mombasa kuelekea Nairobi iko na magari mengi; hii ni barabara ambayo hutumika kama njia mbadala ili kuweza kufikisha watu sehemu za Kaloleni, Mariakani kuelekea Nairobi. Kwa hivyo, mimi nataka niunge mkono marekebisho haya na nimuombea Mwenyezi Mungu mheshimiwa Mwamtsi aishi maisha marefu ili aweze kutengeza barabara za wananchi wa Kilifi kupitia kamati hii. Asante.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you hon. Members for making your contributions.

(Resumption of Debate on the Motion as amended interrupted on 13.2.2019)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Now, hon. Members, we are now reverting back to the principle Motion. Remember, we had started the debate of the Principle Motion as moved by the Chairperson Budget and seconded by hon. Daniel Chai Chiriba and then we started by allowing on a Point of Order amendments from the various chairpersons of the various committees. Therefore, we now need Members to contribution to the Principle Motion but now as amended by the various chairpersons that have been able to move amendments before this Assembly. So, can we have the Member for Jilore Ward who is a member of the Budget Committee to make his contributions.

Hon. Chiriba: Thank you Mr. Speaker for this opportunity. Mr. Speaker, I want to appreciate the effort that this hon. House made through the first interaction with the ADP (Annual Development Plan) document and also appreciate the spirit of the Budget Committee through the able chairperson embracing the different views that are introduced into this document.

Mr. Speaker, allow me to say that I am in support towards the passage of the same and also pray that the hon. Members in this honourable House will not hesitate on the passage of this ADP document given that the different views were accepted and that this House has proved competent in terms of looking at the well being of the people of Kilifi. This is because, if we can have the different Chairpersons coming up with these amendments it shows exactly how the House has a heart for the whole county for looking into the issues that will uplift the livelihood of this county. I stand in support. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much. We can maybe give this opportunity to the Chairperson for Budget to make his final contributions. Before then there is a request from hon. Pascal Jacob Tuva. Kindly be brief.

Hon. Pascal: Thank you. As a Member of this committee, I also support the passage of this Motion because the bone of contention during our first discussion was that Members felt like their views had not been included in coming up on the ADP. We have seen that each and every committee was able to sit down and come up with recommendations and amendments that they felt were appropriate for the Motion to be included.

Therefore, this is a well drafted Motion that has actually taken care of all the views and I think it will take care of the issues that were making Members pull from different directions. Thank you very much. I call upon the passage of this Motion.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Mwanmtsi

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Hon. Mwamtsi: Mr. Speaker, the general ADP is an accumulation of all the views in all the committees now that all the committees' proposals have been passed then let this debate not be dragged. Kindly put the question and we go, Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you, Chairperson Budget.

Hon. Kiraga: Thank you so much Mr. Speaker. I just wish to stress on recommendation number four of the original budget committees' report. You realize that, most of the departments had unrealistic budget projections in the coming financial year. If you look at Water and Environment, the development budget proposal was 1.5 billion, Education 1.2 billion, Lands and Energy 906 million, Roads and Transport 1.4 billion, Gender and Social Services 1.2 billion and Health 3.2 billion that is the development aspect alone leaving away the recurrent.

These are unrealistic targets bearing in mind that the current development budget for the Department of Health is 600 million; how then can they give a projection of 3.2 billion and that is why in our recommendations instead of relying much on the resourcefulness of the county, I think the departments should also think outside the box. Thinking outside the box simply means doing a lot in sourcing development partners to finance those projections. Otherwise thank you so much Mr. Speaker as I am also in support of all the proposed amendments given by the various Chairpersons. Thank you very much.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much hon. Members for all the contributions that we have received. I will now put the question.

(Question put and agreed to)

The Kilifi County Finance Bill, 2018

(Hon. Kiraga on 23.1.2019)

(Resumption of Debate interrupted on 23.1.2019)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you very much hon. Members. Again you will realize this is resumption of debate after we suspended the debate during the special sitting. Therefore, I am now calling upon you Members to make your contributions before I put the question.

Hon. Mwambire: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir. I want to contribute on the resumption of the Report of the Finance Bill tabled by the Chairperson of Budget and Appropriations Committee. As a Member of this House I want to give my support in the amendment made on the ploughing charges which were ...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Order hon. Member. No amendments have been proposed on the Kilifi County Finance Bill, 2018.

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Hon. Mwambire: Thank you Mr. Speaker, Sir.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Hon. Pascal.

Hon. Pascal: Mr. Speaker since the First Reading was done, I support that the clerk to take us through the Second Reading.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Kenga): Thank you. Kindly the mover who is the chairperson budget kindly make your reply.

(Question that the mover of the Motion, be called upon the reply, put and agreed to)

Hon. Kiraga: Thank you so much Mr. Speaker. Before I do my representation, it is unfortunate that the Leader of Majority, the Deputy Leader of Majority and the Chief Whip are not in the House and we are discussing a Finance Bill which is something that has originated from the Government side; the Executive. This is something this House should not entertain and I believe you are going to give a ruling on that.

First and foremost the purpose of a Finance Bill is to authorize the County Government to get taxes from different sources in the county which then go to the resource envelop of the County. We are in a very important stage and I believe this will be adopted today in the House. As a committee we dwell with the changes; most of the items are as capture in the current Finance Act. The minor changes that as a committee we had proposed with the various Sectoral committees as you understand the Act says; to plough one acre using the county tractor is Ksh. 1,000 but the department is charging Ksh. 1,500 instead of Ksh, 1,000. I think that is a violation of the original Act and as a committee we could not entertain.

If you look at the Committee on Agriculture, it has also done something on that item. Look at what the Act says as far as the ambulance charges are concerned. We said the ambulance charges be zero-rated but there has been confusion all around the county; the services offered by the ambulances are being charged either by the nurses, doctors or whoever is concerned in violating the original statement. It was the view of this committee that the ambulance services charges within our county be zero-rated but charges across counties from Kilifi County either to Tana River or Mombasa County be charged at a fee of Ksh. 5000. This fee should also be billed in the patient bills that means the two counties should do some proper recording so that when the patient is being discharged that Ksh, 5000 can be paid at the other end. Thank you so much. Those are the few changes we did.

On the issues of urinary dialysis which is Ksh. 9500 this is going to be for those with NHIF cover and those without will be charged Ksh. 7000. There will be no any other costs; even the CEC Health admitted that there has been some supplementary charges going to the patients but we agreed that these are fixed charges and no other supplementary charges. With those few remarks I say thank you so much.
